Clyde's Remarks about A New Index

Let's start out with the bad news. Being your own critic helps. The first time I looked at the complete printed volume, I realized that we had made a big mistake by not putting the townships in according to area, and that we had missed some very important ones. Rapho was not included along with Mount Joy--the Donegal area being the case in point. We had Sadsbury, but not Salisbury, townships right next to one another. It wasn't long before friends told me about it.

<u>A New Index</u> as a title was criticized, however we still like it and it opens a whole area of making indexes for any subject or title. We will and have considered many items--church records, cemetery records, and publications such as out-of-print biographical and county histories not indexed by name being among them.

The good news far outdistanced the bad and we still continue to get very good reviews and reports about Volume 1. Gary continues to rework and purify beyond what I consider the call of duty, and has learned names in a short time.

Volume 3 will be an index to the first tax records preserved or available for Lancaster County. Most of them started around 1750. We originally had figured on doing 1770 and then 1760, but realized the greater demand was for the early ones.

Lancaster County was formed in 1729 from Chester County; however, preserved or gathered tax records until 1750 are missing. Why? John Aungst feels they have been lost in a fire. I, however, hope that someday we will find them. At least I keep hoping.

Lancaster County had grown very fast from 1729 until 1750. In fact, York County was set off in 1749 and comprises everything west and north of present-day York County. Cumberland County is included in this area and we know many persons lived in that area by

HOW TO USE THIS VOLUME

Volume 2 contains 4,468 names of the taxables who lived in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, prior to the Federal Census of 1790. There are sixteen townships included as well as eight towns and one district which are contained in these townships. Those divisions are listed here along with the number of inhabitants who were taxed.

As in Volume 1, we cannot stress strongly enough that to use this index to your very best advantage. you MUST check all variations of the spelling of the family name. The people taking the taxes were NOT careful with their spelling and the spelling of a family name varied on the individual lists as well as from township to township. The name Tryon appears as Trion and Dryon. Beyers appears as Byers, Buyars, and Buyers. The name we know, as Campbell is spelled variously as Cambel, Cambell, Camble, Campble, and Campel. Kennedy can also start with a C--Canaday. The letters B and P were often interchanged. It seems that in a couple of cases the names Robinson and Robertson were even interchanged. We have made an attempt to note the variations where possible and hope that you will find this helpful. In retaining the

original spellings from the tax lists we have tried to avoid any possible misinterpretation of a name, and leave it up to the researcher to further check the original records of other years if necessary, to verify a family name.

This index contains, not only the name of the individual taxed, but also the township or town of residence (PL), the year from which the record was taken (YR), the taxable's classification (CLS), an indication of oath of allegiance to the Commonwealth if this information is given (ALG), the person's trade if noted by the tax collector (TRADE), and additional comments made by the tax collector or in some cases by the editors (COMMENTS). Editorial comments are found with an ED. notation with the exception of most surname spelling variations.

A note about the classification of persons: not every tax collector indicated whether a person was a land owner or a renter (inmate). In those cases, no classification has been given. In all cases, the single (or freemen) were listed separately.

In the case of indications of oath of allegiance, various townships used different methods of showing this information. In order to be as true as possible to the originals, we have used the same character or an abbreviation.

In some cases, a person appears twice. These have been verified and are correct as indicated. There are those individuals who appear on two different lists due to the fact that they moved from one area to another within the three different years we edited, or perhaps owned land in different areas. John Philip Dehaas is one example.

I might mention the townships in which the various towns appear for those who are searching for the first time.

Heidleberg Town (now Shaefferstown), Mayerstown (now Meyerstown), and Newmanstown are all in Heidleberg Township.

Hummelstown is listed with Derry Township. Manheim Town is in Rapho Township. Middletown is listed with Paxtang Township. Wiconisco District is in Upper Paxtang. Stumpstown and Jonestown are in Bethel Township.

We offer our special thanks to the folks at Lancaster County Historical Society for their help, suggestions, and patience. They are Salinda Matt, Librarian; John Aungst, Administrator; and Jack W. W. Loose, President.

In closing, it is our hope that this volume will become a valuable tool for those who search for their ancestors and their heritage. We would encourage you to continue to strive to find that missing link, the dropped thread. Remember, nothing is a waste that makes a memory. And you and I both know, that when it comes to memories, the genealogist is at his best! Keep searching!

INTRODUCTION TO VOLUME 3

Volume 3, A NEW INDEX, containing 6,015 names, captures the area of Lancaster County in the 1750's, and Perhaps some of the persons living in areas already divided from what was then considered the boundary. York County and Berks County had been created in the 1750 period. The records included in this volume are the earliest available records for Lancaster County after it was founded in 1729. Most of these records date from the early 1750's, however some do not begin until 1756 or 1757. We have included these latter 1750 records to provide a more complete picture of Lancaster County as it was in the 1750 period. In all cases, we have included the first year of available tax records as well as those persons in the second available year who did not appear in the first list. This gives the researcher the added advantage of more names over a wider span of time. This thus provides an extremely valuable tool for the researcher of this time period in Lancaster County.

From 1729 when Lancaster County was erected from Chester County (term used when counties were divided and a new one was established from another county; a term not used today) until the 1750's, the tax records either have been destroyed, lost, or buried in some Place unknown to the present-day researcher. We therefore started to hunt the earliest tax records we could find. All of them are deposited at the Lancaster County Historical Society, and again we had the continued help and blessing of John W. W. Loose, President, John Aungst, Jr., Director, and most of all Salinda Matt, Librarian.

After giving several talks on and about the United States Census, and the inability to find and count all of the meople, at least from the first one starting in 1790, it seems odd that they didn't use the tax collector. President George Washington remarked that he felt sure that we had four million mersons in 1790, after the first census showed that we fell short of that figure. He said he thought many had been missed. When you study these early tax records, it soon becomes clear that very few persons would be or were missed by the tax collector as he has them often marked "Gone" or crossed off from the list. It seems likely that each year a new list was passed on to the new collector or made from the old list to be used for the new year. In this way one is seldomed missed and in itself it would have been a great way to take a census.

One other word about the federal census or United States Census--first, it has never been missed since that first one in 1790, and all through our wars and troubled times nothing has prevented it from being taken. The War of 1812 came a few years later. Both the taking and the counting was done by marshalls until 1830 and we as researchers know how valuable the census is as a research tool. The seventh United States Census of 1850 was the start of the real treat for researches as it is the first one that includes names of every person living in the household. The ninth (or 1870) is considered one of the worst as it was taken a few years after the Civil War and/or War Between the States, and was

controlled by politicians. However, again, no war before or since that time has in a direct way, prevented taking the census. Even the Great Depression of the 1930's is not reflected as 1930 was too early and by 1940 we had recovered a lot from it.

Although the United States has failed to use tax records in census records, we have created a 1750 Census from the tax records. By sticking to the year ending in zero, we have now gone thirty years from our 1780 list, which is another generation back. From the other end (the 1710 settlement) we are now finding we are two generations away, if you consider that some of the 1710 group had grown children and grand-children when they came or at least soon after they arrived.

By 1750 we still had political areas like townships that contained majority groups of Germans or Welsh or Scotch Irish and also carried the names of places from whence they came. The very heart of our county was still held by the 1710 group and has in fact remained the same to the present day. That is to say that those families from 1710 that settled Lammeter, Strasburg, Manor, Conestoga, and Pequea maintained their hold. The Martic thru Sadsbury area and south was Presbyterian and Quaker area, with the large area of Drumore being split in 1738, under ten years after the 1729 formation of townships. Little Britain and Colerain were formed in 1738, followed by Bart in 1744, and then they held for over one hundred years until 1853 when Providence was formed from Martic, Eden in 1855 from Bart, Fulton in 1844 from Little Britain. In this 1750 list you will find some names that are Sone by 1780 and mostly they are the Scotch-Irish Presbyterians who left by whole congregations, such as Muddy Run in the southern part and several in the northern half of the Derry area.

By the 1750's, that area of Lancaster County which is now Dauphin County, had been settled by the great push of Scotch-Irish Presbyterians who were told by James Logan to settle along the border with Maryland. After reaching the Susquehanna River they pushed North and soon it was Donegal, then on to a large area called Paxton or Paxtang. Here we see the tax collector was unable to cope with this large area, and thus he used "The Narrows of Paxton", "West Side of Paxton", and "South End of Paxton". In this area we have used these various lists to create a composite list of the entire area in an attempt to catch all of the people living in the widely settled area.

HOW TO USE THIS INDEX

When you use this index, it is important to first read the introductory material. This material contains much information that will help you in your search and sometimes provide an answer that you otherwise might not think of. Therefore, before searching for your ancestor, you should carefully read both this section and the following section on the tax records themselves.

We cannot stress strongly enough that to use this index to your best advantage, you MUST check all possible variations of the spelling of the family name. To aid you in this search, we have included the variations as they appear in the actual tax records from which we obtained the material. If a name begins with a certain letter or sound, please check the whole listing with that sound. You might find the person listed with an unusual spelling. An added aid in this volume is the constant heading on each page suggesting possible variations as they often appear in the records. You should especially note the changes in vowels and check for the name under as many possibilities as you can think of. Please remember that the beginning letter of many names was spelled numerous ways by different tax collectors. A *P* was often interchanged with a "B"; an "F" with a "V"; and a "T" with a "D". These are only a few of the various possibilities. Check the heading of each mage to see some of the others. We have tried to provide as many variations within the material as possible and ask that you also check under these listed variations. The one person you are looking for Just might be listed under that different spelling.

As in Volumes 1 and 2, this index also contains a listing of the township (PL) where the taxable lived and the year (YR) in which the record was found. The taxable's classification--*F* for freeman, and *I* for inmate (renter, no land) are given where they were provided by the tax collector. In most cases for these years, the only definite classification was FREEMEN, and they were usually listed at the end of the main listing. Finally we have included a longer COMMENT line to this index for we felt that there was often information we would like to include but could not because of limitations. Hopefully you will find these comments helpful in your search for an ancestor or in providing you with more information on him. Editorial comments are usually found with an "ED," notation; although sometimes space did not permit this. Items in quotation marks indicate information that was found in the ORIGINAL tax records.

In some cases, a name appears twice. These cases have been verified and are correct as indicated. In the case where the name appears in the same township two times, the name is listed only once, with a notation that it appears twice in the original list. In those cases where the name appears in various townships, the listing is repeated for each township. If possible, you should consult the microfilm of the originals and pursue these doubles further. In some cases it was two people and in others, it was probably only one listed twice. Further checking would help to verify this.

The following information on the individual tax records used is included in this index to help make the researcher aware of the names of the collectors of the records included and of any other information that might have been included which we were not able to include in the index itself. In most cases this is only minor, but we felt that it would be of interest and perhaps in certain cases very helpful. In certain cases little information is available. Many of the lists of this period began with the

following printed heading (some are handwritten, some have no such heading):

"To (name of the collector) Collector of (township inserted here)

You being appointed Collector of the within Tax, are hereby required to demand of the Persons within mentioned, the several Sums wherewith they stand charged. But if any think themselves aggrieved with what they are rated, acquaint them that the Day of Appeal is the (date) Day of (month, followed by the place). But if you cannot meet with the Person of whom Demand is to be made, leave Notice in Writing with some of the Family, or at the Place of their last Abode, signifying the Day of Appeal; at which Time you are to attend with this Duplicate, and the Names of such Persons in your District as You find omitted herein. Fail not at your Peril. Dated the (date) Day of (month) Anno Domini, 175()"

The dates of appeal varied and were held at the Court House in Lancaster or at the tavern of Mathias Slough. There are those lists from time to time that mention a person who felt his taxes were too high.

BART--The first record is for 1751, taken by John Lingerfield (also Lingfeild). The next record available was for the year 1754. This was taken by William Laughlin. Bart was erected from Sadsbury and the records are mostly Scotch-Irish names, with a few Quakers and Germans.

BETHEL--The first record here is apparently for 1750, although the date is hard to read. It was apparently taken by Constable Martin Crom (Perhaps Martin Krem in the list, although more likely Martin Cromer who appears in the following year) as his name appears under the notation *Return of Bathel Township". At the end of this list is a separate notation: "More setlers of Bathel Township which came In afther wards." Nine men are listed and these are noted with a similar comment line in the index. The next available year is 1751, taken by Henry Sowder. It is interesting to note that Martin Cromer's name is crossed off as the collector and Sowder's is inserted instead. We felt it necessary to include the 1756 list for Bethel Township also as it contains some extremely interesting information. The Colonial Indian Wars were taking their toll on the area and this is quite apparent in this particlar record. The collector was the constable of the township. The notation is found at the end of the list:
