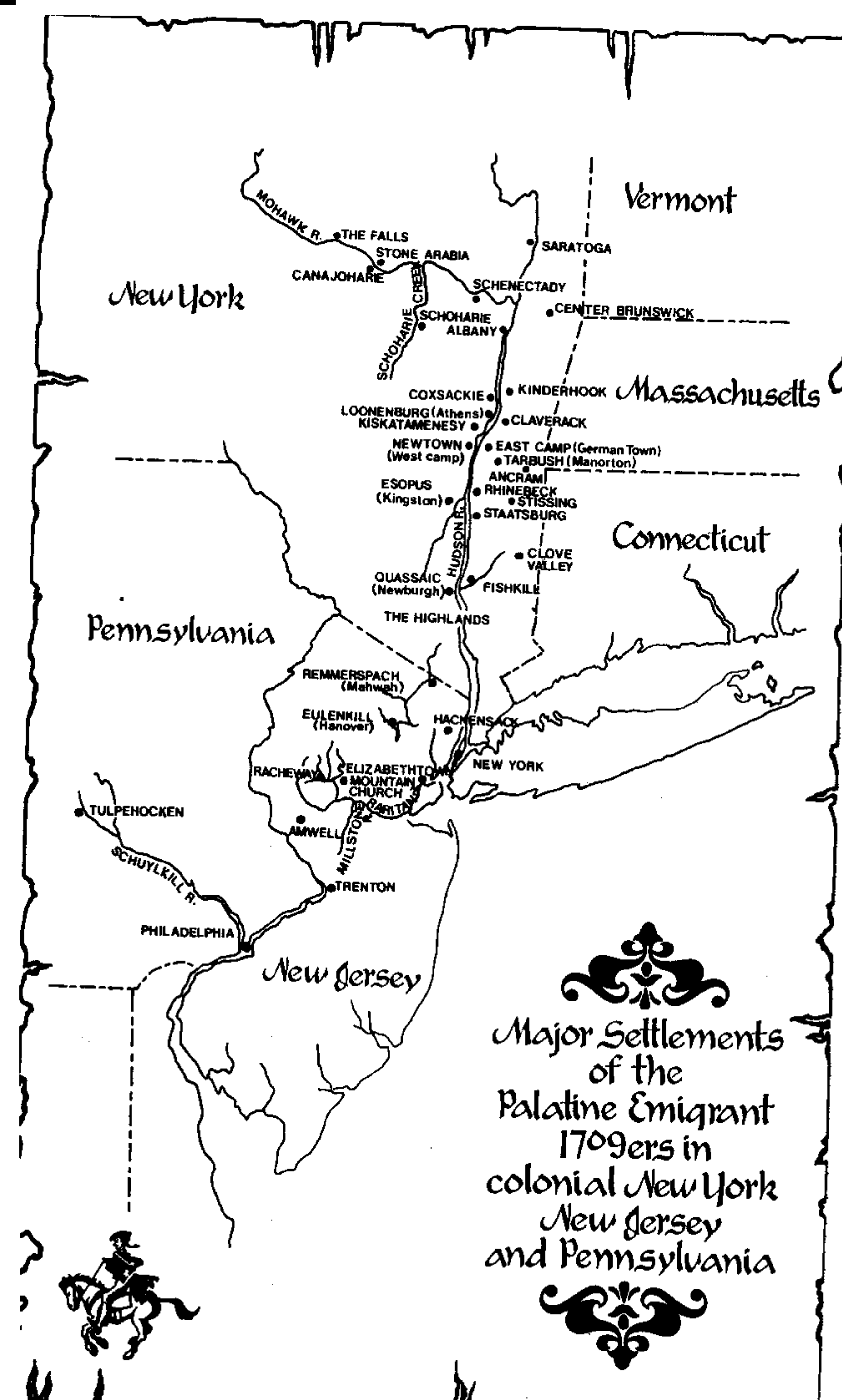

As this was the original manner in which the families were registered upon their arrival, I decided to keep this format in structuring my book.

I have used the "HJ" citation (which stands for my own initials) when, after careful study of all available materials, I strongly believe someone "belongs" in a family structure even though a certain baptism or marriage entry is no longer extant to prove it, or simply to note that a particular connective or statement is my own opinion based on this evaluation of the data.

- i) Catharina<sup>3</sup>, b. 15 Dec 1741 and bpt. Newton - sp.: Hannes Maurers and wife Susanna (Loonenburg Luth. Chbk.). She md. Adam Mattestock (HJ).
- ii) Petrus<sup>3</sup>, b. 19 Feb 1745 and bpt. Newton - sp.: Jo: Jac: Eigener and Hanna Margr. (Loonenburg Luth. Chbk.). He md. Elisabetha Mattestock (HJ).
- iii) Andreas<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 11 April 1748 - sp.: Pieter Eigenaar and Catharina Maurer (Katsbaan Ref. Chbk.).

#### PETER EYGNER'S WIDOW (Hunter Lists #182)

Peter Eygner's wid<sup>w</sup> made her only appearance on the Hunter Lists 1 July 1710. By closely studying the juxtaposition of names surrounding her on these rolls, I believe she actually was #183 Jeremia Eygnerin's wid<sup>w</sup>, and that the incorrect name was entered (HJ).

#### JEREMIA EYGNERIN (Hunter Lists #183)

Jeremia Eygner's wid<sup>w</sup> was noted on the Hunter Lists 4 Aug 1710 in the same location in the journal as #182 above; she also had but 1 pers. over 10 yrs. in her family.

#### PETER FAEG (Hunter Lists #184)

The German origins of the Faeg family were 6580 Idar-Oberstein (14 km. s.w. of Kirn; Chbks. begin 1669, Luth.). The earliest known ancestor of the Tulpehocken pioneer was Johannes Schneider. His son Nicolaus Schneider md. 28 Sept 1671 Anna Margaretha, d/o Wilhelm Koch. Wilhelm Koch d. Sept 1674, aged 59 yrs. and his wife Lucia d. 29 Sept 1679. Nicolaus Schneider was bur. as Nicolaus Feg

27 April 1724, aged 76 yrs., 1 month, 3 weeks, and 1 day; Anna Margaretha, his wife, d. Nov 1697, aged 45 yrs. Johann Peter, s/o Nicolaus and Anna Margaretha Schneider, was bpt. 17 Nov 1672. Johann Peter Feg md. Anna Maria, d/o Johannes Risch, 26 Nov 1697. Anna Maria, d/o Johannes Risch and Anna Margaretha, was bpt. 1 May 1681. The N.Y. 1709er Jacob Risch md. Margaretha Petri the same day at Idar, and a notation after this double wedding mentioned the both these couples have left here and moved to Pennsylvania.

Peter Faeg made his first appearance on the Hunter Lists, next to Johannes Faeg, 4 July 1710 with 2 pers. over 10 yrs. of age and 3 pers. under 10 yrs. in the family; the size increased to 3 pers. over 10 yrs. and 3 pers. under 10 on 24 June 1711. The entry for 24 June 1712 read 4 pers. over 10 yrs. and 2 pers. under 10 yrs., and the notation for 13 Sept 1712 recorded 3 pers. over 10 yrs. and 2 pers. under 10. Peter Feeck was nat. 11 Oct 1715 (Albany Nats.). Peter Feck and Anna Maria with 4 ch. were at Neu-Stuttgart ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). Peter Feg d. 5 Dec 1744, aged 72 yrs. (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). The will of Peter Feck was probated in 1748 (Philadelphia Co. Will Bk. I, p. 68). The ch. of Peter<sup>1</sup> Feg and Anna Maria were:

- 1) Anna Catharina<sup>2</sup>, md. Peter Reed (Will).
- 2) Anna Eva<sup>2</sup>, md. Johann Conrad Weiser (Will).
- 3) Eva Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, conf. as Eva Elisabeth Fetzin in 1720 at Tschoghari at the so-called Fuchsen-Dorp (N.Y. City Luth. Chbk.).
- 4) Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, b. 14 Feb 1713 at Norman's Kill, Albany and bpt. Albany - sp.: Nickel Ecker and Elisabeth Schmid (N.Y. City Luth. Chbk.). She md. Peter Schäffer in 1729 (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken).
- 5) Anna Margaretha<sup>2</sup>, b. 18 Dec 1715 and bpt. Schoharie - sp.: Johann Georg Kast and his wife, and Anna Maria Feeg (West Camp Luth. Chbk.).
- 6) Johann Leonhardt<sup>2</sup>, md. as s/o Peter Feg 2 Nov 1742 Janige Von Huss(en) (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). The Berks Co. Orphan's Court (p. 50) noted 16 May 1766 that Leonard Feck d. 8 yrs. earlier leaving a widow Johanna, since md. to Jno. Roos, and 3 ch.:
  - i) Johannes<sup>3</sup>, the eldest son (Orphan's Court Record).
  - ii) Peter<sup>3</sup>, aged 17 in 1766 (Orphan's Court Record).
  - iii) Anna Maria<sup>3</sup>, aged 14 in 1766 (Orphan's Court Record).
- 7) Peter<sup>2</sup>, md. as s/o Peter Feg 2 May 1743 Christina Karr (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). The will of Peter Faeg of Heidelberg was dated 19 July 1790 and probated 29 Oct 1790

(Berks Co. Will Bk. 3, p. 150). Ch. from that will:

- i) Jacob<sup>3</sup>.
- ii) Anna Maria<sup>3</sup>.
- iii) Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>.
- iv) Eva Magdalena<sup>3</sup>.
- v) Anna Catharina<sup>3</sup>.
- vi) Anna Margaretha<sup>3</sup>.
- vii) Christina<sup>3</sup>.
- viii) Maria Catharina<sup>3</sup>.
- ix) Sophia<sup>3</sup>.
- x) Magdalena<sup>3</sup>.

JOHANNES FAEG (Hunter Lists #185)

Leonard Feg of Schoharie, s/o the late Johann Feg of Oberstein in the duchy of Nassau-Sig, md. Anna Catharina Schutz, d/o the late Conrad Schutz of Langen Sollwest in the earldom of Isenberg, 1 Nov 1715 (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). As noted in the section on #184 Peter Faeg, the ancestral home of this family was 6580 Idar-Oberstein (14 km. s.w. of Kirn; Chbks. begin 1669, Luth.). The earliest known ancestor of #185 Johannes Faeg was Johannes Schneider of Vollmersbach, the same man who was grandfather to #184 Peter Faeg. Johannes Schneider (Jr.) md. 12 April 1689 Anna Margaretha Becker, d/o Martin Becker. Anna Margaretha, d/o Martin and Elisabetha Becker, was bpt. 28 Oct 1672. Johannes Schneider (Jr.) also changed his name to Faeg: the Idar Chbk. mentioned in 1693 that John Veeck has moved to Pennsylvania with wife and ch. A Johan Faech, his wife, and 4 ch. were listed on Capt. Johan Enrit or Encrist's ship in Holland in 1709 (Rotterdam Lists).

Johannes Faeg made his initial appearance on the Hunter Lists 4 July 1710, next to Peter Faeg, with 7 pers. over 10 yrs. in his family. The size increased to 7 pers. over 10 yrs. and 1 pers. under 10 yrs. 31 Dec 1710, after a separate entry had been recorded for his child under 10 yrs. on 4 Oct 1710. Johannis Feeg of Queensbury was a soldier in 1711 (Palatine Volunteers To Canada). Johannes Feeck was nat. 11 Oct 1715 (Albany Nats.). Joh. Feck, Anna Maria Margretha with 5 ch. were at Neu-Stuttgart ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). Widow Anna Margaretha Feg was living in Pa. in April 1745 (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). The ch. of Johannes<sup>1</sup> Feg and wife Anna Margaretha were:

- 1) Elisabetha Barbara<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 25 Dec 1693 (Idar Chbk.). She md. as d/o Johannes Feg 31 March 1714 Frantz Finck (West Camp Luth. Chbk.).
- 2) Leonhardt<sup>2</sup>, md. as s/o Johannes Feeg 1 Nov 1715 Anna

Catharina Schutz (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). Leonhard Feck and his wife Catharina were at Neu-Stuttgart ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). The will of Leonhard Feck was dated 23 May 1743 and probated 2 Sept 1743 (Philadelphia Co. Admin. Bk. E, p. 5). Issue:

- i) Elisabetha Magdalena<sup>3</sup>, md. as d/o Leonhard Feg Dom. 17, p. Trin: 1745 Leonhard Noef (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
- ii) Johannes<sup>3</sup> (Will).
- iii) Anna<sup>3</sup> (Will).
- iv) Anna Margaretha<sup>3</sup> (Will).
- v) Maria Barbara<sup>3</sup> (Will).

- 3) Catharina<sup>2</sup> (HJ), perhaps the Catharina Feg conf. 23 March 1712 at Queensberg (West Camp Luth. Chbk.), unless she was the d/o #184 Peter Faeg (HJ).
- 4) Maria Barbara<sup>2</sup>, md. 15 May 1717 Michael Rieth (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken).
- 5) Maria Margaretha<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 24 Sept 1710 at N.Y. - sp.: J. Jacob Risch, Anna Maria Feeg, and Margretha Kuntz (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). She md. Hermannus Walborn (HJ).
- 6) Jacob<sup>2</sup> (HJ), md. Anna Maria Dausweber (HJ). Jacob Feeck was nat. 11 Oct 1715 (Albany Nats.). He sp. Michael Rieth and his wife Maria Barbara Feg in 1723 (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). The wid/o Jacob<sup>2</sup> md. Zacharias Oenmaest 7 Nov 1724 (Tappan Ref. Chbk.). The ch. of Jacob<sup>2</sup> Feeck were:
  - i) Jacob<sup>3</sup>, b. 11 April 1716 at Packquee - bpt. in Highland - sp.: Theobald Sherer and wife Justina, in their absence Hannes Mittler and wife Eliz. (N.Y. City Luth. Chbk.).
  - ii) Christina<sup>3</sup>, b. 5 Dec 1718 in Highland - sp.: Andreas Volck and Christina Tansweber (N.Y. City Luth. Chbk.).
  - iii) Nicolaus<sup>3</sup>, b. 3 March 1721 at Tapan and bpt. Hackinsack - sp.: Niclaes Neiddebber and Elisabeth Finck (N.Y. City Luth. Chbk.).
  - iv) Margaretha<sup>3</sup>, b. 1 Feb 1723 - sp.: Pieter Haringh and wife Grietie Bogaart (Tappan Ref. Chbk.).
- 7) Nicolaus<sup>2</sup> (HJ), a sp. to Michael Rieth and wife Maria Barbara Feg in 1718 (Reed's Chbk., Tulpehocken). Nicolas Fege was noted on Pastor Sommer's list of Luth. families at Schoharie ca. 1744/45 (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). He d. 25 June 1746, aged 47 yrs. (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). His wife was Margaretha Miller, and she may have been the Old Mrs. Feeg who d. 1 Nov 1772 (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). The ch. of Nicolaus<sup>2</sup> and his wife Margaretha were:
  - i) Jacob<sup>3</sup> (HJ), md. 31 Oct 1749 Anna Maria Vroman



(Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). Jacob Feek was a freeholder at Schoharrie in 1763 (Albany Co. Freeholders). Jacob Feake was in Capt. Thomas Ackeson's Co. in 1767 (Report of the State Historian, Vol. II, p. 845). The will of a Jacob Fack, deceased yeoman of Middleburgh was dated 17 Sept 1797 and probated 12 March 1798 (Schoharie Co. Will Bk. A).

- ii) Johannes<sup>3</sup> (Schoharie Luth. 1744/45 List). A Johannes Veeg md. Jannetje Last 2 Feb 1758 (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). Johannes Feek was a freeholder at Schoharrie in 1763 (Albany Co. Freeholders). Johannis Feake was a soldier in Capt. Thomas Ackeson's Co. in 1767 (Report of the State Historian, Vol. II, p. 845).
- iii) Magdalena<sup>3</sup> (Schoharie Luth. 1744/45 List), d. 24 June 1746, aged 19 yrs. and 6 months (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.).
- iv) Margaretha<sup>3</sup> (Schoharie Luth. 1744/45 List), d. 24 June 1746, aged 14 yrs. and 5 months (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.).
- v) Cornelius<sup>3</sup>, bpt. Nov 1735 - sp.: Cornelis Vroman and Maria Catje Snell (Schoharie Ref. Chbk.).
- vi) Maria<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 25 June 1738 - sp.: Michel Vrymayer and Anna Maria Bauch (Schoharie Ref. Chbk.).
- vii) Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 23 May 1740 - sp.: Jacob Schnyder and Elisabeth Schnyder (Schoharie Ref. Chbk.).
- viii) Peter<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 6 March 1741/42 - sp.: Pieter Sneider and Mary Cathrin, his wife (Schoharie Ref. Chbk.). Pieter Feake was in Capt. Thomas Ackeson's Co. in 1767 (Report of the State Historian, Vol. II, p. 847).

#### HENRICH FÄHLING (Hunter Lists #186)

There were Fahlings found at 6331 Kröffelbach in an area where several Mohawk Valley 1709ers originated: Henrich Fahling d. 1696, aged 55 yrs.; however, no firm connective to the N.Y. family of Failings has been found. Henrik Schling and his wife were listed next to the N.Y. Palatine Koenraat Krants in the 4th party in Holland on Capt. Robbert Bulman's ship (Rotterdam Lists). Henry Fehling aged 24, and his wife, Ref., husbandman and vinedresser, were in England (recorded next to Conrad Krantz) in the 4th arrivals in 1709 (London Lists).

Henrich Fähling made his first appearance on the Hunter Lists 1 July 1710 with 2 pers. over 10 yrs. of age and 1 pers. under 10; the size of the family diminished 25 March 1711 to 2 pers. over

10 yrs. of age, and then increased again 24 June 1712 to 2 pers. over 10 yrs. of age and 1 pers. under 10 yrs. of age in the family. Hendrick Fehling of Annsberg was a soldier in 1711 (Palatine Volunteers To Canada). Heinrich Fallinger, his wife and 3 ch. were noted at Neu-Ansberg ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). In May of 1762 Henrich Failing agreed with his six sons to transfer his real estate to them in return for their support for himself and his wife; this document is a wonderful source for genealogists studying the family, as it names all six sons. Hendrick Feeling was a freeholder of Canajoharrie in 1763 (Albany Co. Freeholders). An endorsement on the back of the 1762 document implies that Hendrick Failing and his wife Mary spent their last days with their son Jacob on Lot #15 of the Harrison Patent in St. Johnsville, and that Henrich d. 1768/9 and Mary in 1767/8. The ch. of Henrich<sup>1</sup> Failing and his wife Anna Maria Kunigunda (probably the Mary named in the 1762 mss.) were:

- 1) Johannes<sup>2</sup> (1762 mss.), md. Maria Magdalena Wagner, the Widow Failing who d. 7 March 1817, aged 97-1-5 (Fort Plain Ref. Chbk.). Johannes signed the acceptance of Pastor Werner in 1751, and was d. by Dec 1765.
- 2) Johann Jacob<sup>2</sup>, b. 9 Oct 1713 - sp.: Jacob Best, and the w/o Martin Zerb (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). He md. 4 April 1756 Anna Maria Catharina Gerlach. He signed the 1762 document granting support to his parents. He wrote his will 21 Dec 1791, and d. between Feb 1797 and May 1799.
- 3) Nicolaus<sup>2</sup>, b. 7 Jan 1716 and bpt. at Schoharie - sp.: Nicolaus Ruhl and wife (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). He md. Elizabeth Snell. Nicklus Fely signed the 1762 mss. supporting his parents and built a stone dwelling near Canajoharie called Fort Failing. Letters of Administration on the estate of Nicholas Failing were granted to Lawrence Gross and Jacob Timmerman 14 May 1791 (Montgomery Co. Surrogate's Records).
- 4) Henrich<sup>2</sup> (1762 mss.), md. 17 July 1764 Elisabetha, d/o Conrad Zimmerman (Stone Arabia Ref. Chbk.). He signed the document promising support for his parents in 1762 and d. in Canajoharie 9 April 1790; his obituary in the Fort Plain Ref. Chbk. recorded that he was b. in 1718.
- 5) Dieterich<sup>2</sup> (1762 mss.), md. Anna Eva (--). He signed the 1762 bond with his brothers. He also was known as Richard.
- 6) Georg<sup>2</sup> (1762 mss.), md. 4 Dec 1770 Catharina Walrath (Stone Arabia Ref. Chbk.). He also signed the 1762 bond.
- 7?) Anna<sup>2</sup>, md. Peter Wormwood and d. 6 Oct 1797.

in Ulster Co. in 1710/11 (West Camp Census). Peter Waggenaer was nat. 31 Jan 1715/16 (Albany Nats.). Peter Wagner and his wife Anna Maria with 2 ch. were at Neu-Cassel ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). Berkenmeyer visited the home of Peter Wagener in 1734 (Albany Protocol, p. 94; see also pp. 96, 104, 107, and 158). He moved in 1723 to the Francis Harrison Patent, n. of the Mohawk River, some two miles above Nelliston and just e. of Garoga Creek; he was an elder at CanatSchoharra in 1734 (Albany Protocol, p. 94). Peter Wagner and (ch.) Johann Peter and Maria Elisabeth were noted on Pastor Sommer's Family List for the Mohawk area ca. 1744 (Schoharie Luth. Chbk.). Data from an old Wagner family Bible is found in N.Y. State D.A.R. Bible Records, Vol. 5., and the family appears on a Family List in the Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk. giving bpts. that probably were performed by Pastor Johann Friederich Hager and entered originally in his chbk. which is no longer extant. The ch. of Peter<sup>1</sup> Wagner and Maria Margaretha were:

- 1) Georg Philipp<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 11 May 1708 - sp.: Görg Philipp Wagner here, and Görg Philipp Wagner from Becheln (Dachsenhausen Chbk.).
- 2) Anna Margaretha<sup>2</sup>, b. 15 April 1712 - sp.: Christian Gerlag and wife Anna Margaretha (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Henrich Dillenbach (HJ).
- 3) Maria Catharina<sup>2</sup>, b. 18 Aug 1714 - sp.: Jerg Ecker, Maria Catharina Jung, and Maria Lies Lauks (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Georg Rösner (HJ).
- 4) Ottilia<sup>2</sup>, b. 16 Aug 1716 - sp.: Rudolp Lilof and wife Utilia (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Isaac Reit (HJ).
- 5) Catharina Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, b. 10 Sept 1718 - sp.: Lampert Sternberger, Anna Lies Haus, and Catharina Leer (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Georg Saltzmann (HJ).
- 6) Maria Magdalena<sup>2</sup>, b. 4 Jan 1720 - sp.: Peter Gloss and wife Maria Magdalena (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Johannes Fehling/Failing (HJ).
- 7) Johann Peter<sup>2</sup>, b. 8 Jan 1722 - sp.: Peter Knieskern, Gottfried Fidler, and Maria Lies Knieskern (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). He md. Barbara Elisabetha Dachstaedter in 1750 (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.). Capt. (later Col.) Peter<sup>2</sup> Waggoner is mentioned often in military records of colonial N.Y. (see Report of the State Historian, Vol. II, pp. 585 - 587, 786 - 788, 791, 882, 886, & 890); see also Penrose's Mohawk Valley in the Revolution, various pages). Col. Johann Peter<sup>2</sup> Waggoner d. 23 May 1813 (Family Bible). His will was probated 15 June 1813, and ch. named therein

cited in Penrose on p. 342. The ch. of Johann Peter<sup>2</sup> Wagener and Barbara Elisabetha were:

- i) Johann Peter<sup>3</sup>, b. 6 Nov 1750 - sp.: Peter Wagener Sr. and wife Maria Margaretha (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.). The Bible says he md. Nancy Bell.
- ii) Johann Georg<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 17 Jan 1752 - sp.: Johan Georg Becker and Catharina Dagstetter (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.). The Bible states he md. Elisabetha Nellis.
- iii) Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 9 Dec 1753 - sp.: Henrich Salsman and wife Maria Elisabeth (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.). She md. a Nellis (HJ, per Bible and Will).
- iv) Maria Margaretha<sup>3</sup>, bpt. 26 Jan 1755 - sp.: Andreas Tillenbach and Margaretha Rösner (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.). She md. Henrich Klock (Bible and Will).
- v) Johann Jost<sup>3</sup>, b. 6 March 1759, md. at Fort Plain in 1784 to Catharina Abeel, and d. there 15 Aug 1848 (Bible).
- vi) Johannes<sup>3</sup> (Will and Bible).
- vii) Anna<sup>3</sup> (Will and Bible). She md. Caspar Leib/Lipe (Will and Bible).
- viii) Maria<sup>3</sup> (Will and Bible). She md. Wilhelm Nellis (Will and Bible).
- ix) Catharina<sup>3</sup> (Will and Bible). She md. Wilhelm Saltzmann (Will and Bible).
- x) Wilhelm<sup>3</sup>, b. 22 Sept 1770 - sp.: William Nellis Jr. and Catharina Engeland (Stone Arabia Luth. Chbk.).
- xi?) Magdalena<sup>3</sup> (Will). She md. Wilhelm Nellis (Will). As the Bible does not mention her, perhaps she actually was #viii above and bpt. as Maria Magdalena or #iii above and bpt. as Elisabetha Magdalena or Magdalena Elisabetha (HJ).
- 8) Maria Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, b. 24 Jan 1724 - sp.: Henrich Sex and Maria Lies Mann (Stone Arabia Luth. Family List). She md. Henrich Saltzmann (HJ).

Some of the dates found in the Stone Arabia Luth. Family List may be either birth or baptismal dates (HJ).

#### JOHANN ADAM WALBORN (Hunter Lists #778)

The German home of this Tulpehocken family was 6200 Wiesbaden (6 km. n. of Mainz; Chbks. begin 1688), entries on this family also at Mosbach-Biebrich/Wiesbaden (Chbks. begin 1674). The father of the emigrant was undoubtedly Joachim Waldborn, bur. as Jochim Wallbrun 10 Sept 1689, aged 60 yrs.; Anna Maria, wid/o the late

Joachim Walborn, d. 30 Dec 1693, aged 57 yrs. (both Mosbach-Biebrich Chbk.). The ch. of Joachim Waldbrunn/Walborn as found in the registers at Mosbach-Biebrich were:

Johann Philipp, bur. as eldest s/o Joachim 21 Dec 1674, aged 15 yrs.

Maria Clara, conf. 1677, with no parents mentioned.

+ Johann Adam, conf. 1680, with no parents mentioned.

Elisabetha, conf. 1680, with no parents mentioned.

Martin Jacob, conf. 1686, with no parents mentioned.

Johann Adam Waldbrun md. Anna Elisab(etha) Zietz (Gietz? - hard to read) 15 Feb 1691 (Mosbach-Biebrich Chbk.). Anna Elisabeth Zietz (Gietz?) was conf. in 1681 (Mosbach-Biebrich Chbk.). Johann Adam Waldborn was called a day-labourer at Wiesbaden in 1696, and a Hoffman in Schützenhof in 1703 (Wiesbaden Chbk.).

Johann Adam Walborn made his initial appearance on the Hunter Lists 1 July 1710 with 4 pers. over 10 yrs. and 3 pers. under 10 yrs. of age. The family was recorded with 5 over 10 and 2 under 10 yrs. on 4 Oct 1710. Jno. Adn Walbourn of Annsberg was a soldier in 1711 (Palatine Volunteers To Canada). Hanss Adam Wallborn and his wife Anna Elisabetha with 6 ch. were at Neu-Ansberg ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). I strongly believe that Johann Adam<sup>1</sup> was the mysterious Andrew Falborn/Walborn listed on the Tulpehocken petition dated 1723; there is no further reference to this Andrew Walborn that has been found, and the written forms of Adam and Andreas may easily be mistaken for each other in 18th century handwriting (HJ). Johann Adam Walborn was on the Tulpehocken tax list dated 1725 (The Hub of the Tulpehocken, by Earl W. Ibach, p. 12). The ch. of Johann Adam<sup>1</sup> Walborn and Anna Elisabetha were:

- 1) Christian Wilhelm<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 27 Nov 1692 - sp.: Wilhelm Späth, Christian Hek (?), and Anna ... (Mosbach-Biebrich Chbk.). Christian Wilhelm Wallbrun was conf. in 1707, aged 14 yrs. (Wiesbaden Chbk.). Christiaen Walborm was a Palatine Debtor in 1712/13 (Settlers & Residents, Vol. I, p. 16). Christ. Willem Walborn sp. Nic. Roul in 1713 (Albany Ref. Chbk.). Christian Walbone secured his tract of 176 acres from Casper Wistar 2 Nov 1739, was a member of the church council at Tulpehocken in 1748, and was nat. 13 Sept 1761 (Shadows of the Rhine Along the Tulpehocken, by Viola Kohl Mohn, pp. 280 & 281). The will of Christian Walborn is dated 1769 (Lancaster Co. Wills: Bk. J, Vol. I, p. 348). Christian Wilhelm<sup>2</sup> md. Catharina Elisabetha Batdorf (HJ). They had issue:

- i) Johann Adam<sup>3</sup>, md. Dom. Felidinda Paschator: 1744 Euphrosina Kasterz/Karsnitz (Tulpehocken Chbk.).

- ii) Catharina<sup>3</sup>, md. Dom. Judica Sunday: 1744 Christoph Knoebel (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - iii) Maria Magdalena<sup>3</sup>, md. 14 June 1748 Georg Conrad (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - iv) Maria Margaretha<sup>3</sup>, conf. Quasimotogeniti: 1744 (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - v) Christina<sup>3</sup>, conf. 9 Oct 1748, aged 16 yrs. and 3 months (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - vi) Martin<sup>3</sup>, conf. 3 June 1750, aged 17 yrs. His tombstone gives dates 15 April 1733 - 3 Feb 1816, aged 82 yrs. (Christ Church Cem., Tulpehocken).
  - vii) Hermann<sup>3</sup>, conf. 1753, aged 16 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - viii) Margaretha Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, conf. 1753, aged 14 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - ix) Christian<sup>3</sup>, conf. 1754, aged 14 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
  - x) Georg Peter<sup>3</sup>, b. 13 June 1744 - sp.: George Peter Batdorf and Anna Elisabeth Goldman (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
- Viola Kohl Mohn's beautifully illustrated Shadows of the Rhine Along the Tulpehocken gives additional ch. of Christian Wilhelm<sup>2</sup> Walborn, including Maria Catharina<sup>3</sup>, Maria Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, and Eve Anna<sup>3</sup>; the will of Christian Wilhelm<sup>2</sup> was unavailable to me to determine if these added ch. belong in family structure (HJ).
- 2) Maria Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 25 Oct 1696 - sp.: Anna Maria - d/o Joh. Weissenfeld here, and Anna Elisabetha - d/o the late Joachim Waldborn - citizen in Mossbach (Wiesbaden Chbk.). Maria Elisabetha Walbuer was conf. 19 July 1710 at N.Y. (West Camp Luth. Chbk.). Strong Tulpehocken tradition says she md. Martin Batdorf (HJ).
  - 3) Christina Elisabetha<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 29 July 1703 - sp.: Barbara Christina - w/o the herrschaftl. Miller Niclaus Linck, and Dorothea Elisabetha - w/o Niclaus Beyer, citizen and baker (Wiesbaden Chbk.). She md. Georg Lössch 3 Dec 1720 or 1721 (Reed's Chbk.).
  - 4) Maria Catharina<sup>2</sup> (HJ), md. Peter Schell 6 Oct 1730 at Tulpehocken (Stoever Chbks.).
  - 5) Johann Hermann<sup>2</sup>, bpt. 29 Jan 1708 - sp.: Joh. Peter Stieglitz - Malditzischer Hofmann here, Herman ... - a bricklayer aus dem Darmstädtischen near Breckenheim, and Barbara Elisabeth - d/o Christian Christ, citizen here (Wiesbaden Chbk.). The Reed's Chbk. shows he md. Maria Margaretha Feg 10 July 1728, and d. 10 Jan 1747, aged 37 yrs.



He was listed with 6 ch. on the 1745 member's list at Tulpehocken (Der Reggeboge, Vol. 7, No. 2, July 1973). The will of Hermanus Walborn was probated 12 Feb 1746/47 (Philadelphia Co. Will Bk. H, p. 220). The ch. of Hermann<sup>2</sup> Walborn and Maria Margaretha were:

- i) Leonhardt<sup>3</sup>, b. 4 April 1729 - sp.: Leonhard Feg and wife (Reed's Chbk.). He was conf. 3 June 1750, aged 21 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.). The will of Leonard Walborn was probated in 1760 (Berks Co. Will Bk. I, p. 67).
- ii) Christina Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, b. 8 April 1732 - sp.: Görg Lösche and wife (Reed's Chbk.). She was conf. 3 June 1750, aged 18 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
- iii) Maria Catharina<sup>3</sup>, b. 12 Oct 1734 - sp.: Görg Müller and wife (Reed's Chbk.). She was conf. in 1751, aged 16½ yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
- iv) Christian<sup>3</sup>, b. 1 July 1737 - sp.: Christian Walborn and wife (Reed's Chbk.). He was conf. in 1753, aged 16 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.).
- v) Johann Georg<sup>3</sup>, b. 15 March 1740 - sp.: Görg Anspach and his wife (Reed's Chbk.). The will of a George Walborn dated 1770 is found in Berks Co. Will Bk. II, p. 84.
- vi) Michael<sup>3</sup>, b. 24 Nov 1742 - sp.: Michael Rith and wife (Reed's Chbk.). He was conf. in 1758 (?), aged 15½ (Tulpehocken Chbk.). Papers in the estate of a Michael Walburn were issued in 1801 (Berks Co. Administrations Bk. 6, p. 32).
- vii) Anna Margaretha<sup>3</sup>, b. 6 May 1745 - sp.: Caspar Rieth and his wife, and the Old Mother Anna Margaretha Feg (Reed's Chbk.). She was conf. in 1760, aged 15 yrs. (Tulpehocken Chbk.). Berks Co. Orphans Court Proceedings Vol. I, p. 53 & 54 mention her and her brother Michael after the death of their father.
- viii) Anna Elisabetha<sup>3</sup>, b. 22 Jan 1747 - sp.: Joh. Brucker and wife Anna Catarina (Reed's Chbk.).
- 6?) Anna Susanna<sup>2</sup>, md. Martin Stupp 28 Dec 1741 at Tulpehocken (Stoevers Chbks.).

Mr. Herman W. Walborn of St. Paris, Ohio should be commended for his life-long dedication and efforts in chronicling this interesting Tulpehocken family (HJ).

# GERHARDT WALRATH (Hunter Lists #779)

The ancestral home of this family was at 6251 Runkel (11 km. s.w. of Weilburg; Chbks. begin 1651). Eva Elisabetha, the w/o Gerhard Walrad, d. 16 May 1693 at Ennerich. Gerhard Walrad, Widower md. Maria Reffi (sometimes written Refer) 12 Aug 1695.

Gerhardt Walrath made his initial appearance on the Hunter Lists 4 July 1710 with 2 pers. over 10 yrs. and 2 pers. under 10. The family showed 3 pers. over 10 on 4 Oct 1710, 2 over 10 and 1 under 10 yrs. 31 Dec 1710, 3 over 10 yrs. on 24 June 1711, 2 over 10 on 29 Sept 1711, 3 over 10 and 1 under 10 on 25 March 1712, 4 over 10 and 1 under 10 on 24 June 1712 for sundry daies, and 3 pers. over 10 yrs. of age and 1 under 10 on 13 Sept 1712. A special allowance for omitted days or family members was given 23 Sept 1712, with 3 pers. over 10 yrs. shown. Gerhard Walrath and his wife Maria with 3 ch. were listed one name (Nicolaus Weber) from Heinrich Wallerath at Neu-Quunsberg ca. 1716/17 (Simmendinger Register). Knittle writes of the tragic fate of Gerhardt<sup>1</sup>, from data based on British sources and The Autobiography of John Conrad Weiser:

In 1718, the Palatines sent John Conrad Weiser, William Scheff and Gerhart Walrath to London to ask for justice. They sailed from Philadelphia, but were robbed of their money by pirates. The ship had to put into Boston for new supplies, and upon reaching London the Palatine deputies were imprisoned for debt. By that time Hunter himself had returned to London to recoup his fortune. He falsely claimed that the Palatines had taken possession of lands in Schoharie already granted to others. He pointed out that the proprietors had only a moderate rent. His suggestion that they be removed to other lands on the frontier was adopted. The Palatines' deputies were not in agreement themselves as to what should be done. This and their lack of financial resources lent feeble opposition to the influence of Hunter. Walrath, homesick, sailed for N.Y. but died before reaching his destination. Toward the close of 1721, Scheff returned but he too died soon - in his case within 6 weeks of his homecoming. At last in Nov of 1723 John Conrad Weiser came back to N.Y. still unreconciled to the government's proposals. (Knittle, p. 204).

The ch. of Gerhardt<sup>1</sup> Walrath and his 1st wife Eva Elisabetha were:

- 2) Johann Friederich<sup>2</sup>, b. 27 April 1696 at Ennerich - sp.: Fridericus Rosper, Johan Peter Wüst, and Juliana Catharina Dampf (Runkel Chbk.). He d. 27 July 1696 (Runkel Chbk.).
- 3) "A Daughter"<sup>2</sup>, b. 8 April 1697 - d. 10 April 1697 (Runkel Chbk.).
- 4) Johann Georg<sup>2</sup>, b. 16 Nov 1697 - sp.: Johannes Rospach,
