JOHN HART, The Immigrant Ancestor of the Harts of Hopewell was born about 1595 or 1600 in England. He migrated to New England in 1635 and settled briefly in Massachusetts, and later in Connecticut where his sons were born. In Berry's Kent England Genealogies p.424 is recorded the Royal Lineage of the Hart Family back 13 generations to Henry III 1216-1272 who married Eleanor of Provence daughter of Raymond Berenger, Comte de Provence.

JOHN HART migrated about 1650 from Connecticut to Long Island, finally settling in Newtown where he died in 1671. Authorities do not agree on which son was granted Letters of Administration, but this author has reason to believe that the letters were granted to John and not Samuel Hart of Newtown. Reference is made to both Ege and Cooley in their books on Old Hopewell Families. John Hart's wife's name was Mary but no record has been found to identify her family. They had five children as follow:

If Rebecca had been by a second wife it would seem that a former dead wife would not be honored unless that second wife's name was also Rebecca. Without proof, it would seem that John Marshall had his four children by Rebecca Hart.

John Marshall was a REVOLUTIONARY WAR PATRIOT as a Minute Man and a Private in Fitz Randolph's Company of N. J. State Troops. His father was also a REVOLUTIONARY WAR PATRIOT as he furnished teams to haul supplies for the American Army. Voucher - Return of Cartage and Labor under contractship of Joseph Inslee, Hunterdon County. Source of this information is contained in a letter to this author from Colonel John H. Ahrens of Princeton, dated 18 December 1963. Conrad was born in Europe, probably in Alsace, in 1729. His wife's name was Anna Barbara, last name unknown. He emigrated to this country and lived in ~~Hopewell, N.J.~~ on a farm near Marshall's Corners on the outskirts of Hopewell, N.J. He died ~~76 Sept~~ 1803. His only son was John born 26 April 1762, d. 26 March 1803. The wife of Conrad who was Anna Barbara died 3 November 1801 and both are buried in the Presbyterian Church Cemetery at Pennington.

Rebecca Hart married John Marshall 29 March 1785. She died 13 May 1791. To this union were born four children.
