Strong-beer, or any other beer, was made, for the destruction of mankind; nor did there exist among the good folks of those times, such a nomenclature of suckers as "Schuylkill Rangers," "Chicken Thieves," "Loafers," "Rowdies," and such like of the same kidney, to partake of such vile liquids, but men went to bed sober, and, as far as is known, women, too. Thus the time progressed until the year 1806, when your correspondent was a mere stripling, and being well acquainted with the town and its inhabitants, as well as their abode, employed his leisure time in compiling a Directory, which, at this distant day, may be a matter of some amusement, if not of information, to the present citizens of the town.

From a reference to this Directory will be found the names of all the householders then living and occupying the various dwellings, of which there were 490 families; and what may appear strange is, that many, very many, of the then names are extinct. What the exact population may have been, is a matter of guess work; but if the usual number of five to the family may be near the truth, then Reading may have sheltered twenty-five hundred persons. And what is most melancholy of the tale, is that only *two* of those registered names are among the living, to wit: one male, and one female who has lived a life of single blessedness thus far. At that time there were no buildings beyond the limits of the Penn plan.

From 1806 we skip on to 1856, and what a wonderful change we behold ! The goodly old town changed to a city, and the spare ground surrounding it, used for cow pasture, now enclosed and variously built up. Important Iron Works established, with a host of other manufactories, Cotton Mill, Woolen Mill, Rolling Mills, Gas-Pipe Factory, Cupola Furnaces, Forges, Machine Shops, and innumerable other operations of a like nature, for husbandry, machinery, as well also as the opening of Iron ores in great abundance, and last, not least, the Railroad and its facilities, carrying immense numbers of live mortals, besides the mineral coal, merchandize and manufactured goods, to and fro, creating a trade and mercantile business very little dreamt of at the date of any former epoch. What marvel then, that under such a state of things, the old town should lose itself in the new City-that population should be immensely increased, and vice and virtue in proportion. Consoling myself, however, that the twenty churches, with their Shepherds among us, may, in good time check the first and foster the second. I am Yours truly,
