26. DAVID<sup>3</sup> HOWELL, son of Richard<sup>2</sup> & Elizabeth (Halsey) Howell, was born about 1657. He was married to MARY HERRICK, daughter of James & Martha (Topping) Herrick. She is named as daughter Mary Howell in the will of her father, James Herrick, dated 12 Aug 1685 (CNYHS 35:168). The only child known from contemporary records is their son David. A consideration of the available evidence indicates that they were the parents also of Daniel Howell (see discussion under 75). In 1675, David witnessed a whaling agreement (SHTR 2:60). He was assessed at 77 pounds in the 1683 estimate. On 14 Nov 1683 David Howell and John Laughton witnessed James Herrick's gift of land to the latter's son William Herrick (SHTR 5:217-218). David Howell died on 2 May 1684 (SHTR 2:282). The inventory of his estate was made two days later by Edward Howell, John Howell, Jr., and Obadiah Rogers with a value of 83 pounds and 2 shillings. His father, Richard Howell, Sr., provided for David's family:

Richard Howell acknowledges that formerly about the time of the marriage of his son David Howell, he gave him 13 acres of land, lying between the house and land of Thomas Jessup at the west, and the land of Robert Norris at the East side' on 15 Jul 1680 (SHTR 2:81). Richard Howell gave 'to his grandson David Howell all that parcel of land lying at Weeckapauge which was in the possession of my son David Howell in his life time and on which his dwelling house now standeth, being 13 acres. He is to have the same when he is 20 years of age, and his mother the widow Mary Howell is to improve the same in the mean time', on 19 Aug 1691 (SHTR 5:232).

The printed record gives the date 1696, but since the entry is in the midst of entries for 1686, the latter is considered to be the correct date. The town records provide information about the second marriage of his widow Mary:

John Larison gives in the day of his marriage with Lemima Halsey to be vpon the 22 day of May 1683, he also gives in the day of his second marriage with the widow Howell to bee vpon ye 20th day of December 1686 (SHTR 2:243).

Jemima Halsey had been born Jemima Woodhull, daughter of Richard & Dorothy (Howell?) Woodhull (see 2), and had been married for the first time to Daniel Halsey. John Larison appeared in Southampton in the 1683 estimate as John Lawrison at 254 pounds. The will of John Lawrison of Southampton in ye County of Suffolk & Province of New York, dated 20 Oct 1693, bequeathed 'to my well beloved wife Mary one third part of all my whole Estate whether moveables or immoveables in this town or wheresoever else it may appear to be my brown saddle horse only excepted' and 'to my daughter Mary Lawrison all ye other two thirds part of my whole estate where or of what kind soever it may be my brown saddle horse only excepted which I give & bequeath to Samuel Cooper of ye town of Southampton aboves<sup>d</sup>'. John Larison died at Southampton on 30 Nov 1693. Daniel Howell was residing with his uncle Josiah at the time of the 1698 census. Mary (Herrick) Howell was living on 9 Jul 1701, when she was paid one pound three pence,

for boarding Samuel Barbour's wife, whom William Herrick had kept for 6 weeks (SHTR 5:164).

27. RICHARD<sup>3</sup> HOWELL, son of Richard<sup>2</sup> & Elizabeth (Halsey) Howell, was born about 1659. His wife was named SARAH. In the 1683 rate list, Richard Howell was assessed at fifty pounds. Between 1683 and 1709, his father Richard Howell, Sr., gave him considerable property: 'three acres of my home lot' on 20 May 1683 (SHTR 5:210); '20 acres of land west of Southampton at Head of the Creek' on 20 Jun 1683 (SHTR 5:209), 'a fifty pound right of commonage through Southampton bounds' on 8 Jun 1687 (SHTR 5:241), 'two parcels of land at yet Great Plaines' on 4 Aug 1698 (SHTR 6:1), and 'the home lot that my son has built on and his house is standing, and somewhat of my home lot joining to his home lot as well make them both equal, and a number of lots elsewhere' on 2 Apr 1709 (SHTR 6:130). In 1694, he was chosen a trustee. In the 1698 census, Richard appears with his wife Sarah, sons Hezekiah, Edward, Obadiah and Christopher, and daughters Dorcas, Sarah and Abigail, residing as neighbors of his parents. He was assessed at thirty pounds in the 1700 estimate. The Parish Rate for 1736 assessed for Richard Howell and son for 40 pounds, 5 shillings and 5 pence. The will of Richard Howell, dated 25 Mar 1737, devised:

to my wife Sarah, my best bed and furniture, and 1/3 of the movables, and the use of 1/3 of all my lands, and all the east room in my house, and the chamber above it, and 1/2 the leanto, and the liberty of my well to draw water; to my eldest son, Edward Howell, 5 shillings, he having received his portion; to my son Christopher, 5 shillings, he having had his portion; to my grand-daughter, Esther Howell, 5 shillings, her father having received his portion; to my son, Arthur Howell, 5 shillings, he having received his portion; to my grand-daughter, Sarah Rose, 5 shillings, her mother having received her portion; to my daughter Dorcas Norris, five pounds; to my daughter, Abigail Pierson, twenty pounds; to my son, Obadiah Howell (whom I make executor), all my lands, meadows, and tenements, and 1/2 a fifty pound right of Commonage throughout the town, besides 1/2 of a fifty pound right in Quogue Purchase, and all the rest of my estate (proved 28 Jun 1740, CNYHS 27:305).

Richard Howell resided in the village of Southampton, at the South End, on the east side of Main street.

Sibel, all my movable estate' (CNYHS 26:266). She appears to be younger than her sister Keziah but born by 8 Jan 1725/6. She was married in 1747 to GEORGE DOTY, son of Joseph & Sarah (Badgley) Doty of New Providence, Union County, New Jersey. He was born in 1723. George Doty owned a mill and resided on Stony Hill. Their children were born at New Providence. George Doty died in 1807.

74. DAVID<sup>4</sup> HOWELL, son of David<sup>3</sup> & Mary (Herrick) Howell, was born about 1678. Richard Howell deeded on 19 Aug 1696 to his grandson David Howell, son of his son David, 13 acres which he is to take possession of when he is 20 years of age, meanwhile his mother, the widow Mary Howell is to have the use of same (SHTR 5:232). He was married to LYDIA (NORRIS) HILDRETH. 'David Howell in Rite of wife' had 1/2 a fifty pound right in the drawing of lots in the 'seder swamps' dated 3 May 1727 (SHTR 2:198). David Howell entered an ear mark in 1735 (SHTR 2:201). The will of David Howell, 'being very sick, dated 13 Oct 1735, devised:

to my daughter, Abigail Howell, eight pounds when she is eighteen years of age; to my daughter Phebe, my Great Bible; I leave to my wife Lydia all my wool and worsted, 'to clothe her self and child withal'; of the rest of my estate, I leave 1/3 to my wife and the rest of my two daughters; I make my two uncles, Josiah Howell and Hezekiah Howell, executors (proved 24 Nov 1735).

Josiah Howell and Hezekiah Howell, executors of David Howell, sold nine acres, including house and land shop, at Kelley's Pond to Daniel Sayre for 63 pounds and 10 shillings on 22 Nov 1735 (SHTR 6:182).

75. DANIEL<sup>4</sup> HOWELL, son (evidently) of David<sup>3</sup> & Mary (Herrick) Howell, was born at Southampton, Long Island about 1680 (being 52 years of age according to his gravestone at the time of his death in 1732). There is no specific evidence as to his parentage. At the time of the 1698 census, when he was 18 years old, he was not residing with his parents but with the blacksmith Josiah Howell (from whom he obviously learned his life-long trade). He was not a son of Josiah (who named his surviving children in his will), nor a brother of Josiah (whose father Richard provided each of his surviving sons with a commonage right), nor a son of a surviving brothers of Josiah (Richard and Hezekiah, all of whose sons are known),

nor a member of the families of Richard's brothers at Southampton all of whose sons and grandsons are known. The only reasonable accounting for the existence of Daniel Howell is that he was a son of Josiah's older brother David who had died in 1684 for whom only one child (his son David) is identified in the Southampton records, and for whose family his father Richard provided only 13 acres of land. Daniel Howell, having learned blacksmithing, removed early to Maidenhead, Burlington (later Hunterdon, and finally Mercer County), New Jersey in the same community with his cousins Christopher and Arthur (and other individuals from Southampton), and purchased land adjoining that of his uncle Josiah Howell. Daniel bought land there from Samuel Coxe and John Hutchinson in 1702. He was married to MARY who was described by their grandchildren as a sister of Elizabeth, wife of Ebenezer Prout who had come from Connecticut. Her surname may have been Reed as the will of William Reed of Trenton, Hunterdon County, dated 23 May 1759, made executor 'my kinsman, David Howell', (a son of Daniel & Mary Howell) (NJA 33:347). She was born about 1684. Their son John was baptized at Maidenhead on 6 May 1713, and daughter Hannah on 17 Jun 1715 (from the records of the First Presbyterian Church of Philadelphia, PGM 19:281,283). He was one of the inhabitants of Hopewell Township named in the deed dated 9 Mar 1709 for land at Hopewell for the Ewing Presbyterian church. He was Justice of the Peace of Hunterdon County in 1725. The will of Daniel Howell, blacksmith, of Trenton, Hunterdon County, dated 30 Aug 1725 and proved 2 Aug 1732, provided:

for wife Mary, son, David, land on east side on the middle road, Trenton, lot on the west side of Kings Street, Trenton, lot of meadow in Maidenhead great meadows; son Daniel, when 21, house at Trenton, half of meadow lot in Maidenhead great meadows; son Joshua, 100 acres of plantation where testator lives, also lot in Trenton, adjoining Josiah Howell's lot; son John, balance of plantation where testator lived, when of age; lot in Trenton; daughters, Phebe, Elizabeth, Hannah, Mary and Prudence, when aged 18; Daniel to be taught trade of glazier, with codicil dated 21 Apr 1732: son Hezekiah, having been born since writing of will, to him a lot of land with a house (NJA 30:248).

Daniel Howell died aged 52 years on 25 Apr 1732. Mary Howell died aged 76 years on 24 Sep 1760. They were buried at the Presbyterian churchyard, Ewing.

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Oct 1832 at which time he was aged eighty-four years and was residing in Lee Township, Athens County, Ohio. According to depositions in a court case involving land (Chalkley: Records of Augusta County, Virginia II:91-92), William Howell was married to ELEANOR GILMORE who was born about 1753. She was the daughter of John Gilmore who obtained a lease of land on Patterson's Manor Creek, Hampshire County, on 14 May 1771. Eleanor had died before November 1796 when the depositions were taken. The will of John Gilmore, dated 10 Aug 1773, mentions daughter Eleanor and names William Howell and Ezek Totten as securities (Sage & Jones: Early Records of Hampshire County, Virginia, p. 116). Ezekiel Totten of Hampshire County granted a parcel of land in East Jersey on 15 Nov 1787 to William Howell of Hampshire County (Sage & Jones p. 57). The Genealogy and History of the Solomon Townsend Family by Hollis L. Townsend states:

He remained in Hampshire County several years after the War before his exodus to nearby Randolph County where he operated a mill on the Cheat River. As a listed head of a family, he is credited with a household of seven persons, of whom one was black. He was married to ELIZABETH (GRAY) GOFF between 1791 and 1796. She was the widow of Salathiel Goff who died on 27 Jun 1791. William & Elizabeth's daughter Rachel was born at Glenville on the Cheat River, Randolph County, (later West) Virginia. They later removed to Meigs County, Ohio and settled in Columbia Township on what became known as 'the Cline farm.' Both were buried at Temple cemetery, Meigs County. The gravestones were inscribed: 'William Howell Died March 28, 1842 in the 94th yr. of his age' and 'Elizabeth wife of William Howell died May 2, 1839 in the 86th yr. of her age'.

153. DAVID<sup>5</sup> HOWELL, son of Daniel<sup>4</sup> & Mary Howell, was born in 1705. He was married to MARY BAKER, daughter of Timothy & Susannah (Matthews) (Smith) Baker. She was born in 1707. He purchased 120 acres of land on the Delaware River in Hunterdon County, New Jersey in 1758 from Noah Wills. He built a stone house bearing the inscription 'D.H. 1775' (sold after his death to Jonathan Hill). The will of David Howell of Trenton, Hunterdon County, New Jersey, dated 17 Dec 1774 and proved 20 Nov 1775, left:

to son John 20 shillings; wife, Mary, all household goods and profits of plantation; granddaughter Liddy Hartley a bed; son Joseph £25; son David £25; son Daniel £25; son Amos £300 to remain in hands of my son Timothy for the support of Amos during his life; to Amos Hartley £20 if he lives to be 21; son Timothy all my land where I live (NJA 34:258).

David Howell died aged 70 years on 24 Oct 1775. The will of Mary Howell of Trenton, Hunterdon County, 'widow of David Howell', dated 22 Aug 1782 and proved 28 Jan 1788, left:

to son Amos my bed and the yearly interest of £ 30, and my sons are to have the care and keeping of him; grandsons Noah Howell and John Howell £ 15 each; sons Joseph, David and Daniel, and my granddaughter Lidia Hartley, household goods; son Timothy £ 30; grandson James Hartley £ 5 when 21; son Daniel loan office certificates; son Joseph negro Bob; sons Joseph, David and Daniel, rest of estate (NJA 35:207).

Mary (Baker) Howell died aged 79 years on 15 Jan 1786. They were buried at Ewing.

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Howell died aged 54 years on 18 Jan 1785, and was buried at Ewing cemetery. The will of David Howell of Trenton, Hunterdon County, New Jersey, dated 24 Oct 1784 and proved 8 Feb 1785, left:

to son Absalom £ 500; eldest daughter Prudence £ 150, and goods which belonged to her deceased mother, also a looking glass now in possession of Daniel Scudder, the bequest of John Scudder, father of her mother, Prudence Scudder; second daughter Patience £ 100, and a silver snuff box formerly her mother's; youngest daughter Charity £ 100; my eldest son Israel my real estate; executors, son Israel and my brother Daniel Howell and friend Daniel Clark (NJA 35:207).

280. DANIEL<sup>6</sup> HOWELL, son of David<sup>5</sup> & Mary (Baker) Howell, was born about 1739. He was married with New Jersey license dated 10 Aug 1763 to DEBORAH ROSE, daughter of Stephen & Elizabeth (Prout) Rose. She was born about 1741. The will of Daniel Howell of Hopewell Township, Hunterdon County, New Jersey, dated 1 Apr 1809 and proved 5 Mar 1812 (NJA 41:192), named his wife Deborah, sons Ebenezer, Ephraim, Daniel, Henry B. and Jonathan, and daughters Elizabeth Anderson, Mary Hart, Patience Phillips, Eunice Howell, Phebe Howell and Deborah Howell. Daniel Howell died aged 73 years on 27 Feb 1812. Deborah (Rose) Howell died aged 84 years on 14 Nov 1825.

635. EPHRAIM BILES<sup>8</sup> HOWELL, son of Daniel<sup>7</sup> & Hannah (Biles) (Howell) Howell, was born at Pennington, Hunterdon County, New Jersey on 20 May 1816. He was married at Troy, Ohio on 23 Dec 1846 to ELIZABETH BRELSFORD, daughter of Daniel & Mary Brelsford. She was born at Charlottesville, Virginia on 10 Feb 1821 (although it appears that she told the census taker that she was born in Ohio). They were residing in Brown Township, Miami County, Ohio at the time of the federal censuses in 1850, 1860 and 1880. Ephraim Biles Howell provided this information for the 1884 Miami County history:

Ephraim B. Howell when a boy in his native State, had the privilege of the common schools, which was no longer enjoyed after coming West. From 1838, he was duly engaged in opening out the farm now owned by Joshua h. Duer, for which the compensation was the products of a limited number of years. There he remained until 1843. When he engaged in farming rented land; and various changes were made until he purchased his present land of 30 acres, in Sec 19, Brown township where he located in the spring of 1853 and in 1856, he left his farm and engaged in keeping a tollgate on the Piqua and Urbana Turnpike, which he held 13 years. At this time he emigrated West to Hancock county, Illinois (1872). Not liking the country, he returned in 2 1/2 years and located on his farm where he now resides.

His son Gilbert provided this information:

Ephraim just missed being drafted into the Union Army during the Civil War. Boys were being lined up and picked by lot; and the lad standing next to Ephraim was taken. He was a farmer and cobbler by trade. Ephraim joined the Owens Baptist Church of Sugar Creek on April 22, 1837. He was a very religious man.

The family travelled overland by covered wagon to Hancock Illinois about 1870. After a few years they returned to Piqua, Ohio. Elizabeth (Brelsford) Howell died at Fletcher, Ohio on 25 Aug 1891. After her death he made his home with his three sons spending a portion of his time with each at their homes. Ephraim Biles Howell died at the home of his son Gilbert at Piqua, Miami County, Ohio on 29 Jan 1897. They were buried at Fletcher cemetery, with children Deborah and Perry.
