CROSSET, Thomas, apprentice, age c. 20 - runaway from George House, of Phila., shoemaker [8/31]

WRIGHT, Thomas (alias Thomas Smith), weaver by trade, who says he was born in Maryland and has lived on Long Island and in New England - suspected of stealing a horse [9/7]

OWEN, Evan, late of Phila., dec'd - his widow, Mary Owen, will sell 700 acres of land [9/14]

MATTOCKS, Edward, from Herefordshire, servant, smith by trade - runaway from William Cox and John Copson, of North-East, Maryland [9/14]

FERRY, William, servant, age c. 19 - runaway from Lawrence Smyth, of Monmouth Co., N.J. [9/21]

FLETCHER, Robert, dec'd - accounts with estate to be settled with his widow or with his son, Thomas Fletcher [9/21]

WORLEY, Henry, of Chester Mills, dec'd - accounts with estate to be settled with Evan Morgan, of Phila., administrator [9/21]

CHARADON, Clement, servant, age c. 18 - runaway from William Hudson, Jr. [9/28]

JONES, James, late of Lower Merion, gentleman, dec'd - accounts with estate to be settled with his widow and with Joseph Jones, his son, administrators [10/5]

JOHNSON, John, servant - runaway from Benjamin Fairman, living near Phila. [10/5]

DEMPSY, Valentine, servant, age c. 18, rope-maker by trade, lately imported with Capt. King from Ireland - runaway from John Gouré at New-Castle [10/12]

HULL, John, of Newton, Conn. - arrested and committed to Fairfield Goal for murder of his three-months-old son - Boston dispatch of Sept. 28 [10/12]

JONES, John, servant, age c. 20 - runaway from James Steward, of Phila., tailor [10/16]

MAN, John, servant, age c. 18, tailor by trade - runaway from Alexander Frame, of Phila., tailor [10/16]

SITCH, John, servant, age c. 24 - runaway from Robert Miller, in Cain [10/19]

WILLIAMS, William, Welsh servant, age 21 - runaway from Samuel Jones, of Cadbury, Chester Co. [10/19]

BURNET, Mrs. Mary (wife of Governor William Burnet, of New York) - died Saturday last in New York City - New York dispatch of Nov. 6 [11/9]

PECKFORD, Richard, servant, stone-cutter by trade - runaway from Anthony Wilkinson, of Phila., carver [11/9]

Will, Negro slave - runaway from Charles West, shipwright [11/23]

PATTISON, Sarah (now wife of James Nisbitt, of Perth Amboy, tailor) - has eloped from her husband [11/23]

RYLEY, Dennis, late of Acrington, Lancashire, England, but now of the Twp. of New-Hanover, Burlington Co., West New Jersey - seeks news of his uncle, John Cunliff, said to reside in or near Christeen, New-Castle Co. upon Delaware [11/30]

TALBOT, Rev. John, formerly minister at Burlington - died there on Nov. 29 [11/30]

WATKINS, Thomas, servant, age c. 40 - runaway from George King, of Phila., mast-maker [11/30]

MARSHALL, John (son of Alexander Marshall, of Over-Stowey, near Taunton, Somerset Co.), who has been absent a considerable time at sea or beyond the seas - reward offered for information about him [1/2]

KANN, Conrad, and his wife Mariana, Palatines, who arrived in Phila. on Oct. 30 from London in the ship John Galley, John Ball master - have run away to escape paying for their passage [1/16]

DERRYMAN, Mary, who at Tollard-Royal on Sept. 29, 1727, wrote a letter directed to her son, Arthur Oliver, at Phila. - her son is asked to claim the letter [2/6]

TOWNSEND, Grace - died Friday last in Phila. in her 58th year [2/6]

STAPLER, Stephen, late dec'd - his plantation will be sold at auction in Nottingham, Chester Co. [2/13]

Peter, Negro slave, born in this country, age c. 30 - runaway from Isaac Norris [3/14]

GARRETT, Amos, noted merchant of Annapolis, Md. - died there on March 8 [3/21]
