The Society wishes to call the attention of its friends to the splendid service rendered by Russell Bruce Rankin to the cause of New Jersey Genealogy. He was one of the five founders, to whom our organization owes its existence, the others being Chester N. Jones, Col. Charles A. Andrews (our first president), Sylvester H. M. Agens and the late William J. Conkling. This group being officers of the New Jersey Society Sons of the American Revolution and greatly interested in stimulating its growth, compiled a large body of data pertaining to old New Jersey families believed to be likely to furnish acceptable candidates for membership. On September 17, 1921, they organized The Genealogical Society of New Jersey, with a view to continuing and systematizing this work, enlarging its scope and perpetuating its results. On April 5, 1924, the Society was incorporated under the laws of this State.

From the first, one of the important activities of the Society has been the copying and tabulating of gravestone records. Copies of the inscription in eighty-five cemeteries located in eleven counties have thus far been made. Mr. Rankin has been one of the most indefatigable workers in this field, devoting much time to the tabulation of records and the preparation of an index of the gravestone records of this State here-

RECORDS OF NEWTON AND HADDONFIELD MONTHLY MEETINGS

NOTE: The Newton Friends' Meeting started as early as 1684 at the beginning of the settlement of English speaking people in the neighborhood, when meetings were held in the homes of members. Newton Meeting House was located in what is now West Collingswood, Gloucester (now Camden) County. The old grave yard still exists alongside the Reading Railroad tracks at Newton Creek.

The Haddonfield Monthly Meeting came into existence 12th month, 1721, at which time it was changed from Newton. It was the same congregation, but a new meeting house in a different location two or three miles away.

5. Sara de Mille, bapt. 30 Dec., 1663, married 20 Oct., 1686, Isaac Kip.
6. ANTHONY de Mille, bapt. 14 March, 1666, is not named in his father's will. There was an Anthony de Mille, of New York, who on April 26, 1706, married MARIA PROVOOST, a daughter of Benjamin Provoost and his wife, Elsje Alberts.

Thus far we have obtained only a few clues as to the de Mille ancestry in their ancient home in Flandres, before they moved to the Dutch Republic, or the free Netherlands.

In the old Abbey-Church of St. Michel at Antwerp there is a tombstone with the following inscription (translated):

(In the outer margin): "Here lies buried, FRANCOIS DE MIL, Lord of Westerem and Faerden, who died in the year 1544, the 28th of February."

(In the inner margin): "Here lies buried, HEVLEWYCK BAERS, his wife, who died in the year 15—."

The center of this tombstone shows in relief an armorial shield with helmet, crest and mantling, under which is the following legend:

*Weest Milde Van Herte,
Vaert Naer Vwen Staet.*

(translated):

"Be mild of Heart,
Behave According to Your Standing."

The word "Milde" of course, is a pun on the family name "de Mil." The word "Vaert" is an allusion to the lordly manor of Faerden, or "Vaerden." The arms on this tombstone agree with those which are described as follows:

DE MIL (Province of Bruges): "*Argent*, three eagles, *azure*."

The Arms on the tombstone further show that the eagles are "éployés," and facing the dexter, or heraldic right. The mantling shows *argent* and *azure*.

The crest consists of the head and shoulders of a female figure, dressed *azure*, the hair tied with a ribbon, *or* (?), issuing from a wooden stockade, or palisade, *natural*.

THE INFLUENCE OF PURITAN AND OTHER NEW ENGLAND ELEMENTS IN NEW JERSEY

BY SAMUEL COPP WORTHEN

The average American, whose knowledge of our history is largely based on the text books used in the common schools, does not think of Puritans or New Englanders of any kind as an important factor in the population of New Jersey. However this State has not escaped the tide of migration which began to flow southward and westward out of New England less than half a century after the date of its first settlement and which has borne the spirit of Puritanism all the way across the Continent. Thus has New England leavened the lump of a vast polyglot population and helped to create outside her borders a bigger and better "Yankeeland" restricted as to longitude only by the two oceans.

Long Island was the first region to receive the overflow from New England. There the Puritans met and readily mingled with the Netherlanders and Huguenots, who were their spiritual kin. The next great objective for colonization was New Jersey. It would not be easy to estimate definitely the number of New Englanders who settled in the Jerseys between 1665 and the outbreak of the Revolution, but an examination of the annals of the several communities will show

The *St. Charles* freed the prisoners and conveyed the Dutch ship and its passengers to New Amsterdam, where they arrived in September, 1654. Twenty-three of these Jewish families, who had kept their Jewish faith, became the nucleus of the first Hebrew congregation in the Middle States, the venerable Portuguese Synagogue founded at New Amsterdam (after some deliberations with Governor Stuyvesant) in the year 1656, and at present located at Central Park West, New York City.

At the time of the arrival of the Rev. Johannes Theod. Polhemius on the *St. Charles* at New Amsterdam, where his wife and children soon joined him, the young congregations on Long Island were in need of a minister. They regarded the coming of Domine Polhemius as an unexpected answer to their prayers. He was duly called and installed as minister of the churches of Midwout and New Amersfoort. There and in Brooklyn he served until his death in 1676.

The salary remaining due to Polhemius for services in Brasil was paid to him by the Classis of Amsterdam. For the losses of property sustained by him through the surrender of Dutch Brasil, "JOANNES POLHEMIUS, late minister in Brasil," claimed restitution on April 19, 1663,¹¹ from the West India Company. This claim was again forwarded on May 9, 1663, by "Hendrick van Vleuten, as power-of-attorney for Johannes Theodorus Polhemius, minister in New Netherland." Undoubtedly the full amount was paid to Polhemius.

The Rev. Johannes Theodorus Polhemius died at his home at Brooklyn, N. Y., on June 8, 1676, almost eighty years old, probably without ever having revisited his native land. He had served the Dutch Reformed Churches in Germany, Holland, Brasil and New Netherland for a period of about fifty-five years.

¹¹The treaty of peace between Holland and Portugal in 1654 was not ratified until Dec. 15, 1662, and not until Jan. 10, 1663, were the States General of the United Netherlands able to notify the inhabitants of the Provinces and the Dutch colonies that the Brazilian claims could be filed by any one entitled to them according to the 25th article of the peace treaty.

HENRY THOMAS RANDALL

On January 31st our Society suffered the loss of an esteemed member, Henry Thomas Randall, of Summit, N. J. He was born January 9, 1877, at Providence, R. I. His father, the Rev. Nelson Birney Randall, A. M., D. D., a clergyman of the Baptist denomination, widely known as an able and eloquent evangelist, was born at Springville, N. Y., and was a descendant of John Randall, an early settler of Westerly, R. I., in the following line: John,¹ John,² Benjamin,³ Sylvester,⁴ Charles,⁵ Epaphroditus,⁶ Nelson Birney.⁷ The Rev. Dr. Randall married in 1863 Sarah Harriet Thomas, daughter of Deacon Henry C. Thomas, a pioneer leather manufacturer of Gloversville, N. Y. She was a woman of exceptional character and ability, long identified with the missionary activities of the Baptist denomination. Her mother, Mary Beach (Johnson) Thomas, was a daughter of Caleb Johnson, whose father, Jacob Johnson, was a soldier and patriot of the American Revolution.

Henry Thomas Randall was graduated from Columbia (A. B.) in 1898 and received (also from Columbia) in 1900, the degrees of A. M. and L.L.B. For about twelve years he was associated with the law firm of James, Schell and Elkus, of which the Hon. Abram I. Elkus (former Judge of the New York Court of Appeals and Ambassador to Turkey) was a

PRE-AMERICAN NOTES ON OLD NEW NETHERLAND FAMILIES

CONTRIBUTED BY LOUIS P. DE BOER, LL.B., M. A.

NOTE.—This is the twelfth of a series of articles by Mr. de Boer, the families already presented being Ackerman, Burtis (Alburtis), Duyckinck, Elmendorf, Frelinghuysen, Van Gaesbeeck, Van Harlingen (-de Cerf), Kip, Van Lodensteyn (-De Bevoise), De Mille, and Polhemus. The next article will take up the Van Sysen family.

RAPALLIER—RAPALJE

"JORIS JANSEN RAPALJE," as he was commonly known among the Dutch, *alias* GEORGES RAPALLIER, son of JEAN, was one of the earliest Walloon settlers—subjects of the "High Mighty Lords" the States General of the United Netherlands—who arrived in New Netherland, on the ship bearing the young colony's name, in the spring of the year 1624.¹ With him arrived his bride, CATALINE TRICAULT, usually called by the Dutch CATLYNTJE TRICO. Few of the names of the other passengers on the *New Netherland* in 1624 can be found, and those only by inference from other well established facts. It seems certain, however, that there were also some members of the DE LA GRANGE and DU TRIEX families aboard the ship.

¹The event of the first attempt to form an agricultural settlement in the thus far exclusively trading colony of the Dutch West India Company in North America, has been internationally commemorated in 1924, during the "Huguenot-Walloon New Netherland Tercentenary." The student of American history and genealogy is naturally familiar with the various publications on the subject.

New Governor of New Netherland, Peter Minuit, arrived on Manhattan, and in the same month purchased that island from the roaming Indians who had been in the habit of coming there every season. The whole island, which in 1625 had only a few selected spots under cultivation, was now available for farming. In 1626 Cornelis van Voorst, with a gang of lumbermen, seems to have been in charge of clearing the virgin soil. Minuit thereupon ordered all farmers in New Netherland to concentrate on Manhattan. This caused the Rapalje family to leave Fort Orange in 1626. In the summer of that year lower Manhattan counted two hundred and seventy white inhabitants. There Joris and his thrifty wife Catalyntje, with their family ever increasing, opened the first hotel or public inn, supplying their needs in part from their own garden. Later Joris extended his property by purchasing lands on the Walebought, Long Island, from the Indian chiefs Kakapeteyns and Pewichaas. The Long Island plantation became the family homestead from which the descendants branched off in all directions. Catalyntje Trico, as widow, lived there alone in 1680, growing her own flower and vegetable garden, while her children and grandchildren had built new homes all around there. Her descendants, according to the Labadist visitors of 1680, numbered one hundred and forty-five, and "will soon reach 150."

In the early 18th century, when the Long Island Dutch began to spread over parts of New Jersey, a branch of the Rapalje family located in Sussex County, N. J. In the early 19th century members of the Rapalje family of Deckertown (now Sussex) went to Seneca County, N. Y., and founded there a new branch.

In the English, French and Dutch records the family name is variously spelled, mostly phonetically and according to the national orthography. Reconstructed it would read DE RAPALLIER, or DE RAPALLIER, of which we favor the latter form. The name is at present spelled Rapalyea, Rapelje, Raplee, etc.

INFLUENCE OF THE NETHERLANDISH PEOPLE IN NEW JERSEY

BY CORNELIUS C. VERMEULE

Settlement by people from the Netherlands, at New Amster-
dam, followed close upon Hudson's discovery of the river and
harbor in 1609. There have been distinctions, perhaps unwar-
rantly fine, between settlement for trade and so-called per-
manent settlement. We know that on Hudson's return to Am-
sterdam, merchants sent a ship, in 1610, to Manhattan, that
in 1614 they built a fort up the river and also sailed up the
Delaware. The same year they obtained a charter from the
States General and had meanwhile continued to send ships.
In 1623, the ship New Netherland, commanded by Cornelis
Jacobsen Mey, brought a considerable number of settlers, large-
ly Walloons, who built homes on Manhattan Island. That same
year Mey ascended the Delaware and built Fort Nassau, where
Gloucester now stands. Just when settlement began at Paulus
Hook and Hoboken, on the New Jersey side of the Hudson is
not recorded but when Michael Pauw, Lord of Achtenhoven
and Burgomaster of Amsterdam, took title from the Indians in
1630, Hoboken already had its Netherlandish name, and Paulus
Hook was recognized as a strategic point for trade. Perhaps it
will be conceded therefore, that Netherlandish influence had

MRS. EDWARD S. RANKIN

CONTRIBUTED BY SAMUEL COPP WORTHEN
President of The Genealogical Society of New Jersey.

The Society regrets deeply the decease of Mrs. Julie S. J. (Russell) Rankin, one of its members, at her home in Glen Ridge on December 6, 1928. She was the mother of Russell Bruce Rankin (editor of this magazine) and the wife of Edward Stevens Rankin, who is a trustee of the New Jersey Historical Society and a well known writer on historical subjects.

Mrs. Rankin was born and educated in Newark, but spent part of her early life in Columbia, S. C., to which place her maternal grandparents, Robert and Edith B. (Thorne) Swaffield, removed at the beginning of the Civil War. Mr. Swaffield came to Newark from Devonshire, England, about 1833. He was a manufacturing clothier and a pioneer in the chain store plan, conducting stores for the output of his Newark factory in Newark, New York, Providence, Milwaukee, Columbia, S. C., and Augusta, Ga. His daughter, Elizabeth Mary Swaffield, born in Newark in 1838, married Leonard Warren Russell, a descendant of early Colonial English and Scotch stock. His line from William Russell of Cambridge, Mass., was as follows: William¹, born in England, settled at Cambridge in 1645; John²; John³, one of the proprietors of Brimfield, Mass.; Adonijah⁴; Solomon⁵, a Revolutionary soldier who settled at Bethlehem, N. MARRIAGES OUT OF MEETING

NOTE.—When a member of a Friends' Meeting desired to marry a member of another meeting, a *certificate of clearness* to marry was asked for, but when a member married outside of the meeting by Governor's license, or otherwise, this was called going *out in marriage*, and frequently resulted in disownment if proper acknowledgment were not made. From a genealogical viewpoint such records are quite valuable clues.

The dates given are those of the meeting at which mention is made that the marriage had taken place. When a name appears twice it does not necessarily indicate a second marriage out of meeting. The latter entry may be an acknowledgment years later.

VAN DE WATER

BENJAMIN VAN DE WATER is the ancestor of the New
Netherland family of Van de Water which exists in America
today. He was a merchant of Haerlem and Amsterdam who
never came to this country but died in the city last mentioned.
There in 1654 his widow, ELISABETH MEERMAN,¹ married
WALEWYN VAN DER VEEN, widower of CATHARINA VAN
FORGE, a notary public. Thereupon, with the children of her
first marriage, she followed her second husband to New Am-
sterdam. We have a facsimile transcript and translation of
the marriage contract made at Amsterdam, April 18, 1654, be-
fore notary Jan Volckertsen Olye. The contract was intended
mainly to protect the property of the mother of the Van de
Water children; and on November 8, 1664, in the Court of
New Amsterdam (then lately renamed "New York") this
proved to have been a wise precaution. The Van de Water
children were the four brothers, HENDRICK, JACOBUS, PIETER

EDITORIAL NOTES AND CORRESPONDENCE

WANDELL-POINIER BIBLE RECORDS. The following records are taken from an old Bible in the possession of the Rev. Joseph F. Folsom, a Trustee of this Society, and Recording Secretary of the New Jersey Historical Society. The Bible lacks title pages to both the Old and New Testaments, but was probably printed in England before 1774. Between the Old Testament and the Apochrapha are the following:

"John Wandell His Book, Roatt in Janyary the 26, 1774. New York the 26 Day of January in the year 1775, John Wandell bornd in the year 1739 in the Mont of September the 14 Day. Married in the Mont of October the 17 in the (year) 1761 to Jane Van Emburgh Bornd 1743, March the 27."

Below this are two records in different handwritings as follows:

"John Wandell Poinear. Born October 29, in the year 1798. Baptized by Parson Beach."

"Jane Wandell Poinier died January 3d, 1804, aged 13 months and 10 days."

INDIAN INFLUENCE ON NEW JERSEY ANCESTRY

BY SAMUEL COPP WORTHEN

President of the Genealogical Society of New Jersey, member of the New Jersey Historical Society, The New York Genealogical and Biographical Society, The Institute of American Genealogy, and the New Jersey Society Sons of the American Revolution.

Rarely if ever do conquering invaders wipe out a whole population "without trace." There is instead an amalgamation, in which, according to circumstances, the old stock or the new predominates. In Spanish and Portuguese America aboriginal blood is in the ascendant. In the French portions of Canada it is to a marked degree influential. In the United States it is at a minimum, but must nevertheless be reckoned with. No state is wholly free from it. Indian strains are obscure and have received little attention, yet here and there we see them rise to the surface with startling distinctness. Probably many more exist than the present generation has knowledge of.

The influence of the aborigines has come down to us in two ways:

(1) By an actual infusion of blood, and (2) By contacts which have molded character. In the more than four and a quarter centuries which have elapsed since Europeans first trod the soil of North America, influences arising from their relations with the native races have acted and reacted strongly upon both peoples.

The Indians have made a less vivid impression—both
