"<he> was French..., his father and uncles having emigrated to this country from Lorraine...His wife's ancestry was German, and both were Catholics."

"Agnes was the second of five children"

"her half broth George"

"nearing her eleventh year, Agnes went as a boarder to Eden Hall Convent in Torresdale. ... a few miles from Philadelphia"

"her mother, a Baltimorean an an ardent Rebel" p. 18 "birth of her sister Kate...Kate died in infancy"

"It was April 22, 1865, and Agnes had just passed her tenth birthday"
