 7-9-1767: Elizabeth Scott, wife of Abraham, certificate to Kennet. (Formerly from Gwynedd.)
 1770: Hannah Scott, now Benson, disowned for marriage out.
 5-9-1771: Abram Scott, wife Elizabeth and six children, Rachel, Amos, Jesse, Rosseter, Esther and Thomas, certificate to Wrightstown.

 Asenath Scott, born 8-17-1789, daughter of Elizabeth Scott, married John Valentine. They were received into membership at Marlborough Meeting, 12-8-1812.

Abraham Scott, of West Bradford, died intestate: Letters of administration were granted Jan. 24, 1770, to John Dowdle: Sureties, John Webster and Isaac Peirce. Witnesses, Jno Pedrick and Edwd Bettle. Inventory, Feb. 15, 1770, by George peirce and Samuel Worth, who were qualified before Thomas Worth Esq., 24-15-0.

On Aug. 11, 1772, a supplementary inventory of a bond, dated Feb. 25, 1768, for £50, with interest since, signed by John John and James John, of Vincent.

Jaine Bond of Wediclar (Wadiclar?) Lane, Spinster, dau. of Thomas
Bond, deceased, were married 8-26-1687, at Clement
Parker's house, Bradley Hall, in Chippin.
(Lancaster or Preston No. Mtg.)

The will of Thomas Wilson, late of Lancaster in the Kingdom of
England, but now of Philadelphia, bears no date but was proved Nov.
25, 1699. Of this he appointed as executors his friends John Scott
late of the Thet(?) in Yorkshire, and Anthony Morris of Philadelphia
with the advice of the monthly meeting of Philadelphia.

Anthony Morris renounced the administration 9-15-1699. Letters
were granted to John Scott 9 Mo. (Nov) 25, 1699.

There is reason to believe that Thomas Wilson was a passenger
on the Britannia and arrived in the Delaware River by Aug. 25, 1699.
There were many Friends among the passengers. During the voyage a
pestilence, - probably typhoid fever, - broke out and fifty of the
passengers died at sea and twenty more after landing. See sketch
of Thomas Musgrave in The Friend, xxviii, 6, and Potter's American
Monthly, iv, 169.

The minutes of Philadelphia Monthly Meeting, beginning 9-24-
1699, contain several references to their care for the children of
Thomas Wilson and John Scott's sets as executor. The latter having
settled within the limits of Falls Monthly Meeting, this meeting,
by request of Philadelphia Friends, exercised care in the matter.

John Scott and wife Jane were probably passengers on the Brit-
annia. John's death occurred in the 10th or 11th Mo. 1700, and on
11 Mo. 6, 1702, John Whitacre and Jane Scott, widow, declared their
intentions of marriage at Falls Mo. Mtg. Their son John Whitacre
was born 5-14-1704. They also had a son Robert Whitacre. Some of
the Scotts and Whitacres removed from Wakefield, Bucks County, over
the river to Kingwood, N.J., and thence to Virginia.

In 1714 John Whitacre purchased 600 acres of land in Wakefield
where they were living in 1742.

Just what children John Scott left is unknown, but Ann, Sarah,
Henry, Thomas and John may have been of the number.

John Baldwin of Wakefield, weaver, and Ann Scott of said place,
spinster, were married 12 Mo. 8, 1707, at Falls Meeting.

John Whitacre and Jane Whitacre were the first to sign as near
relatives, indicating with certainty that Ann Scott was the daugh-
ter of Jane

John Scott is mentioned in the wills of John Smith (A. 206) and
Christopher Atkinson (A. 203). In one of these he is described as
Late of the Hill in Yorkshire, but now on board the Britannia.

Will Book B. is a copy of the original and the copyist may have
mistaken Hill for Thet.

11-31-1700: "The friends appointed to look into the business
relating to Thomas Wilson's Estate Report that the said Willson's
Executor is dead, Therefore Samuel Carpenter & Nicholas Walln are
desired to write to the Monthly Meeting at the falls concerning the
matter and to do what may be further needful on the Orphans account

4-27-1701: A letter received from Bucks County signifies that
when John Scott's plantation is sold they will pay the money be-
longing to Thomas Wilson's children.

7-28-1704: William Biles informs that the man who married the
widow Scott is willing to pay the money but wants the accounts to
see the amount. (See earlier minutes forward.)

Falls Monthly Meeting:

2-2-1701: The letter from the Monthly Meeting at Philadelphia
to the meeting concerning the Estate of the Orphans of Thomas Wil-
son deceased, in the hands of Widow Scott, was read, whereupon the
meeting appoints Joseph Kirkbride, John Surket, William Biles and
Edmund Lovet and Phineas Pemberton or any four of them to speak
with the widow and endeavour to get it secured and give an account
of what is done to the next meeting.

3-7-1701: The friends that were ordered to speak with Jane
Scott concerning the securing the orphans of Thomas Wilson do say
that they have spoken with her and that they find no other but that
she is willing they shall be secured and therefore Joseph Kirkbride
and William Biles are ordered to write to the monthly meeting at
Philadelphia and signify unto them what care is taken therein, and
sign it on the behalf of the meeting."

1-4-1701-2: The friends of Philadelphia Monthly Meeting hath
desired the meeting to speak to John Scotts widow about Wilson's
children's money friends have spoke with her and she is willing
to pay it what she has in Tobias Dimocks hands to Philadelphia
meeting's order when she hath a discharge. Tobias Dimock is de-
sired to give friends an account of her answer in behalf of this
meeting.

12-3-1702: John Whiticher and Jane Scott declare intentions.

1-2-1702-3: "A minute was proposed to this meeting from the
quarterly meeting at Philadelphia, to desire the care of this meet-
ing and in particular of William Biles to secure the money that

lies in the hands of the late widow of John Scott, belonging to Thomas Wilson's children, being about seventeen pounds: this meeting doth desire Richard Hough and Francis Hague to speak with John Whitticar about it," &c.

'Will of Thomas Wilson, late of Lancaster in the Kingdom of England, but now of Philadelphia: not dated: Proved Nov. 20, 1699.

All estate to use of children for their education & putting them to trades, &c., and to be divided if any residue, when they are of age.

Friends John Scott, late of the Thet in Yorkshire, and Anthony Morris of Philadelphia, to be executors, with advice of the Monthly Meeting of Philadelphia.

Anthony Morris renounced administration, 9-15-1699, and letters were granted to John Scott.

At Philadelphia Monthly Meeting, 9-24-1699: Anthony Morris, Griffith Owen & John Jones are appointed to assist John Scott in putting out the Children of Thomas Wilson late deceased & also to assist David Brientnall in putting out an orphan of Thomas Lansdale about three years old.

10-29-1699: "Anthony Morris, Griffith Owen & John Jones are desired to acquaint John Scott that it is the request of this meeting that he appear here next meeting or the week before, in order to provide for Thomas Wilson's Children, and to satisfy this meeting concerning the said Thomas Wilson's Estate which he hath carried out of the County."

11-26-1699: "John Scott being present at the request of the last meeting in order to give satisfaction concerning the Children & Estate of Thomas Wilson deceased, after some time spent about the same, Griffith Owen, John Jones, John Kinsey, Pentecost Teague, William Hudson, John Godson, or some of them are desired to advise and assist the said John Scott about putting out the said Children, and to see that their father's Estate being out of the County be secured for them, and to End all matters relating thereto."

12-23-1699: "The friends appointed to assist John Scott in putting out Thomas Wilson's children, and to see that the Estate be secured, reporting that they are not yet put out, they are desired to continue their care therein Samuel Carpenter being also by the last preparative Meeting appointed to see that John Scott give Security to the Orphans Court in the County of Bucks."

2-28-1700: "The friends concerned with Thomas Wilson's Children are desired to take care that John Scott be obliged to disburse so much of their father's Estate as may be requisite for the maintenance of the three younger Children, and if there is necessity of present supply & the said friends disburse any money on their account, the meeting will see them paid."

5-26-1700: "The friends formerly desired to take care of Thomas Wilson's children are desired to see those bound who are provided with masters with the Consent of John Scott viz^t To Samuel Bulkley & Michael Blunston, and that they would desire John Scott to see those other two Children bound to Phineas Pemberton & Samuel Jennings, and as for the two youngest, that they be provided for till they can be put out."

8-25-1700: "This meeting being informed that notwithstanding the Endeavours used by order of this meeting towards the Securing of the Estate of Thomas Willson in John Scott's hands for the use of the said Wilsons children, and that in order thereunto an Inventory thereof was sent to Phineas Pemberton, yet nothing Effectual hath been hitherto done, by reason of the indisposition & delatori-ness of the said John Scott, whereupon Nicholas Walln and John Kinsey are appointed to use the best Endeavours they can for accom-
plishing it with all convenient speed."

At Falls Monthly Meeting, 8-5-1747, a certificate was requested for Thomas Scott, wife and son Thomas, to Bethlehem.

7-2-1747: Some obstruction reported.

8-1-1758: "Thomas Scott and John Whitacre being removed with their Families some considerable time since and neither of them having yet had a Certificate, Benjamin Taylor & Timo Smith are thereupon appointed to make enquiry concerning them and if they find nothing to obstruct they are desired to prepare Certificates for them and produce to next Meeting for approbation."

10-6-1758: "The Friends appointed to enquire concerning Thom-
as Scott and John Whitacre Report that with respect to Thomas Scott it appears that there is a Difference subsisting between him and his Brother John Scott, which they apprehend is a reason why he should not at present have a Certificate."

At Kingwood Monthly Meeting, 7-10-1758: Thomas Scot, wife, son and daughter, certificate from Falls.

"John Simcock and James Willson are desired to go to Thomas Scots & John Whitacres and Enquire into the Conduct of their Fam-
lies and to make report how they find their Conduct to be in Life and Conversation Since their settlement within the Compass of this Monthly Meeting."

8-10-1758: Thomas Scott Jr. complained of for being the father of a child and marriage out to another woman: has also left the province.

9-14-1758: He is disowned. Copy of testimony to be sent to his father that he may get it if he returns.

Abraham Scott of the parish of Bartholomew of great London, Mercer, son of Thomas Scott of the same place deceased, brought a certificate from Pell Int. Mtg dated 5-26-1699.

The inventory of the estate of Thomas Scott, Mercer, was dated Feb 11. 1690.

Ann Scott, widow of Thomas married John Ball of whose death she writes to Abraham in 1704.

Abraham writes from Phila. 12-12-1704^{1/2} that he has a prospect of marrying Hannah Scott, widow of John Scott near Burlington, with whom she ^{had} lived many years. John Scott & Hannah Lambert in 2-4-1695 Chester Int. Mtg. Hannah Scott received a certificate from Burlington to Philadelphia dated 5-13-1704. was clear of marriage engagements.

Abraham Scott having returned to England received a certificate from London 2 weeks Int. to Philadelphia dated 11-12-1701.

Oct 6, 1707, he was again in London and agreeing with Capt Thomas Cleeves to ship goods to Maryland in company with Wm Draxson and others.

His wife appears to have been a daughter of Thomas Lambert

A bond was given by Hannah Scott, and Henry Brusson the estate of Chaffin 6th Mo. 6th 1696.

Hannah Scott widow of Benjamin Scott; 8th of 10th Mo. 1697, late of Lenthorough of West Jersey; to her eldest son Samuel Heinball, land and plantation in the town of Burlington, also my great brass kettle, with an iron pot, and 5 Pounds. Joseph Heinball 5 Pounds. Benjamin Heinball 15 Pounds. Edward Heinball 15 Pounds. Thomas Heinball son of Samuel 10 Pounds. Benjamin my silver box; to said Edward two silver spoons; to said Thomas a silver spoon he calls his own; to Grace Hollingshead; wife of John H. silver spoon; and red knit waistcoat. Benjamin and Edward Heinball, executors.

Amount of inventory 103 Pounds, 6 shillings, approved 10th Mo. 23rd 1697.

At Chesterfield Meeting 1st Mo. 7th 1694, John Scott and Hannah presented their intention of marriage, for the first time. The following month they presented them the second time, and they were given liberty to accomplish their purpose according to the good order of the Society.

Thomas Lambert and Mary Margaret Scott went through the same at the same place and time.

Will of Martin Scott, dated 4th Mo. 15th 1708, to his brother in law Thomas Lambert, 70 Pounds. To Edward Lucas do. 70 Pounds, to sister Elizabeth 70 Pounds. To a friend Robert Berkham 30 Pounds. Cousin John Lambert 30 Pounds. The residue to brother John who with Thomas Lambert, and cousin John Lambert are executors. Amount of inventory 868 Pounds, 4 shillings 1 pence.

John Scott's will 6th of 3rd Mo. 1708, to his wife Hannah who is sole executor, plantation in Burlington of 430 acres, to his brother Martin 100 Pounds to brother Thomas for his child Mary 10 Pounds. John Lambert 20 Pounds. Mary Ann Ruth Lambert 5 Pounds each, Elizabeth Verbalda 5 Pounds. Balance to his dear wife Hannah. Amount of inventory 5,656 Pounds 7 pence.

Martin Scott Township Nottingham, Burlington Co. N.J. Wills to Nathaniel 200 Pounds 10 shillings. To Jasper Scott, supposed to be in the army, 5 Pounds. Balance of estate divided between Thomas, Israel, Martin, Elizabeth, Benjamin, Noah and Susannah. Signed 11th Mo. 28th 1773. Abraham Skinn and Jos. Coalman executors. Recorded 12th Mo. 6th 1773.

Scott produced a Certificate for himself and wife from Abington monthly
meeting which was approved.

Records of Wrightstown Monthly Meeting show Abraham Scott laid before
this meeting August the 3th 1771, a Certificate from Uckland monthly meet-

Henry Scott's will Nov. 17th 1773, To his children, John 200 Pounds, Jersey currency: with land and plantation where he lives, Joseph the same, Henry the same, Abraham the same and the choice of three horses except the mare mother rides, Jonathan where he lives, Thomas 300 Pounds Jersey currency, Hester 100, Rebecca 100 Pounds, Priscilla 100 Pounds, Samuel 500 Pounds, Joseph executor. Recorded Nov. 26th 1773.

Jonathan Scott of Burlington gives all his personal property, and real-estate to his wife Mary land house and lot to his two sons John and Samuel. His wife executrix. 12th Mo. 14th 1716; Proved 2nd Mo. 30th 1756.

Wm. Scott of Penns Neck, County of Salem, N. J. To Wm. Scott 5 shillings, proclamation money and no more of my estate. To John and daughter Ann the same. To wife Susannah one-third of removable estate, Balance to Henry, Elizabeth, Susannah, Robert and Joseph, wife executrix. May 17th 1759. Recorded May 26th 1759.

William Sands was married to Mary Scott 10th Mo. 27th 1789. For 1739 not 80 3rd Mo. 3rd 1731, Jacob Scott and Hannah Forsyth were married.

Jacob Scott and wife produced a Certificate from Abington to Chesterfield N. J. dated 11th Mo. 3rd 1741. And 2nd Mo. 6th 1749, Jacob Scott and wife returns to Abington.

A Certificate received at Abington for Jacob Scott and wife from Chesterfield New Jersey 13th of 6th Mo. 1749.

Certificate given by Abington Friends to Jacob Scott and wife to settle at Gunpowder, Maryland 10th Mo. 25th 1756.

Esteemed Friend,

Thy very kind letter of 18th to hand, I am very much obliged to thee for the information, and feel under obligation to thee for the time thee must have devoted in looking up this information. Hope that I shall be able to recompence thee by a return of information at no distant time.

I have another family that I have been working on for some time, but hesitate to trouble thee with the work, after the great kindness thee has already extended to me. I will lay it before thee, and if it is not imposing on thee, I will be thankfull if thee will give me some assistance, if not to much trouble, and work connected with it, providing thee has the information.

I have done considerable work on the family, and have gathered up the family, after they come to Maryland. Quite a number of the descendants are to be found in this locality.

Gunpowder Monthly Meeting records show that 2nd Mo. 26th 1772, Abraham Scott Elizabeth his wife, and 6 children Rachel, Amos, Jesse, Rositer, Hester, and Thomas Scott produced a Certificate to that meeting from Wrightstown Monthly Meeting.

I desire to learn who the ancestors of this Abraham Scott were, and where they came from.

I have some information that I will enclose that may assist thee, This paper appears to show several Abram Scotts, that are difficult to trace unless we had some more knowledge of the particular family.

Thanking thee for the many kindness thee has extended to me I remain thy friend.

Dear Friend:- I do not remember just when thee visited us but times and conditions change. My dear wife passed away nearly four years ago and as my children were not living at home with me I sold my property in West Chester and came to that of my eldest son, near Media, where I am very comfortably fixed. He is sales manager for a leather-bolting firm in Philadelphia but has a farm of about 70 acres here, largely devoted to fruit. My youngest son has a farm nearer West Chester and my daughter, a graduate of Wellesley, is a teacher in a boarding school.

As my historical and genealogical collections were too large to find room here I sold the greater part to the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, for \$5,000; but I receive more inquiries for genealogical information than ever before and am not able to gratify all. My collections not being arranged for public use, nor even for my convenience as formerly, many persons do not receive prompt attention, and some not at all.

I wish I had time to go to North Carolina and copy from the meeting records of Friends there. Many of the Society removed there from Pennsylvania, and from there northward to get away from slavery. A very interesting story of the latter, partly fictitious, was published in The Quaker, about two years ago. This publication has ceased to exist for lack of sufficient patronage. The first editor, a very admirable woman, of Indiana, lost her life by a railway accident.

Our friend Lewis K. Stubbs is still at his post in the banking business and I meet him occasionally.

Thee has doubtless seen my ancestral chart, which are in considerable demand. A Genealogical Society has been organized in one of the western states and I lately sent 500 blank charts to them as they propose for all their members to fill their ancestry as far as known.

If thee will fill up the enclosed chart with thy Stubbs, Cox and Madock ancestry as far as known I will see if I am able to add anything to it.

If thee will give me the date of thy visit to me at West Chester I will have a better understanding about more recent discoveries.
