Having a desire to perform a social visit to some of my relations in Pennsylvania; I set out from my own home (situated between the two branches of Penshawkin Creek, on Land formerly purchased by my Grandfather's Grandfather Mr. Mattacke in the year 1681; which Land & House, are near the south Corner of Chester Township, in Burlington County, State of New Jersey) on second day the 17th of Mo., 1825.

Walked to Henry Harrington's house on the N. side of a Creek which I crossed over, on the bridge in the public road, leading from Moonstown to Cooper's Ferry's opposite - Philadelphia 14 miles distant from Camden as appears on a Map published in 1808 by John Hills — here I met with Abraham Harrington, (brother to Henry) from Ohio; after I had done some repairing to Henry's Clock; walked on to Delaware River, where I was put over in a small boat called a "batteau" by a son of Robert Heaton, who kept the Ferry on the Jersey side, for which I paid 25 cents being landed on the Pennsylvania side a little distance above the entrance of Penshawkin Creek at Mr. Brick's Ferry, now kept by John Risdon, son in law to Robert Heaton; I proceeded

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along the Road which appears to be the only Public One, between Penepesk and Pogueston Creeks, leading from the River side, up to the Turnpike, called at this place "Bristol Turnpike" { a goose Town } This Road I came passes over land where it was intended to have built the city of "Philadelphia" had the River been clear of Rocks, opposite this place, being $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile wide where I crossed:

I came to the House of Jonathan Enocks, about 8 o'clock in the evening of this day intending to stay with him all night, to which he consented, and gave me the following information: that his house (which is on the N.W. side of the 1st Turnpike road) was situated about half way between S^t. Penepesk & Pogueston Creeks. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ miles N.E. from Philad^a and near a Church house called "Saints Church." With him lived Rachel Mattack now 74th years, with whom I had conversation, tho. she was very dull of hearing:

She says her grandfather's name was George Mattack that he married a Mary Foster, who had 3 brothers & 2 sisters, that married so (viz)
