- 1 **EDWARD**, plf. in York Ct. 1670 against Roger Kelly. Shoals wit. 1672.
- 2 **PETER**, Wells, 1677. List 124. O. A. York, Mar. 1679-80. With Saml. Harmon appr. John Foxwell's est. 1680, prison keeper 1682. M. dau. or stepdau. of George Parker, perh. dau. of Wm. Johnson. In 1683 Parker and w. Hannah deeded est. to son-in-law Peter Bass for life supp. and to bring up Eleazer Johnson as his own ch. D. bef. 25 June 1684 when court restored land to Parker, £5 to be secured to young Peter Bass at 21. Ch: Peter, under age 1684. Jonathan, who, instead of Peter, recd. the £5 from Saml. Johnson, 'successor to George Parker,' and ack. receipt in Boston 1701.

- BASSON**, Richard, b. 1625, d. Boston 8 Nov. 1716, 'aged 91.' Fined for drunkenness (Barsum) at Portsm. 1659, John Sherborne bondsman; Scarb., abs. from meet. in 1667, liv. near Dunstan; Falmouth 1683-4. Lists 237e, 238a, 226. Wife Elizabeth, ±73 in Aug. 1728, knew Dunstan early. List 234b. Ch: Gershom, seaman, Boston, adm. gr. to his f. 1699. Samuel, b. 1677, d. Boston 20 Mar. 1705, m. 25 June 1700 Mary Pickworth. Ch: Samuel, Richard, Mary, b. 1701-5. One Mary m. (int. 16 July 1722) John Eakins of Carolina. Katherine, d. 14 Feb. 1702. John, b. Boston 30 Dec. 1691.
- Bastens (?), Joseph, Gt. Isl. 166-. List 311a.
- BASTEE** (Bastard), Walter, fisherman for Peter Lewis, sued by Henry Dering 1673; Cape Eliz. 1683; N. H. 1695. Lists 226, 66.
- BASTON**, a parish in Lincolnshire, Bastin pecul. to Devon.
- 1 **DANIEL** (7), was deeded 150 a. by his brothers and sisters 1713, and sold out to bro. Saml. Stewart 1721-2. He was implicated in escape of John Tracy, forger, 1714. Jury 1715. One of those under Capt. Moulton in Col. Westbrook's command listed as dead 25 Dec. 1724. 24 Apr. 1725. M. Prudence Stimson in Wells, 20 Dec. 1715. Ch: Prudence, b. 15 May 1719. Sarah, b. 23 Sep. 1722. Both bap. 30 Apr. 1727 at Ipswich, where a Wid. Boston d. 10 May 1745.
- 2 **GERSHOM** (7), joiner, with sev. residences, Scarb., late of Wells, 1728; York 1733, Killingly, Conn., 1736, after a stay at Woodstock, during which he recovered against John Morrill of Scarb.; ret'd. to Maine and in 1742 James Baston and James

jr. q.c. to him 150 a. He and 3 of his sons went against Louisburg. With w. Elizabeth he joined the ch. 1756; she liv. 1760 and he 1764. Ch: Elijah, Elizabeth, b. 1718. Mary, b. 1720. Joseph, b. 1722. Shubael, bp. 1724. Thomas, b. Scarb. 22 Dec. 1728. Wentworth, m. Hannah Weare of No. Yarm. Daniel, youngest son.

3 **JAMES** (7), gr. j. 1703, bondsman for Francis Sayer 1704, joined ch. 1705. Lists 269abc. With bro. Daniel and two Bucklins, one the constable, contrived escape of John Tracy, forger, 1714. M. Elizabeth Royal, dau. of John. D. bef. 1769. Ch: James, bp. 1712, called by f. 'my only son and child,' 1748. After being pub. to Mary Freeman 6 Oct. 1733, he m. 1st 10 May 1739 Eleanor Morrison, who joined the church the same year; 2d 2 Dec. 1743 Sarah (Storer) wid. of Uriah Nason, dau. of Jeremiah. 1+5 ch., incl. John Royal, bp. 30 Mar. 1740, bur. at Cape Ann 1776, s.p.

4 **JOHN**, Sheepscot, 1664. Y. D. ii. 8.

5 **JOHN**, ±32 in 1673, with Henry Light ±30, set Edward Holland from the Island to Piscataqua, after Elizabeth Oliver's baby was born.

6 **JOSEPH** (Boston), soldier, 1693-4. List 267b.

7 **THOMAS**, housewright, a Wells wit. 1674.

Retired to Essex Co. twice during Ind. Wars; 18 Feb. 1678-9 he was formerly of Wells now of Ipswich; Salem 1680-1685, and there a 2nd time after May 1690; also lived at Charlestown where adm. inhab. Gr. j. 1674, 1702; jury 1691, 1701. Lists 265, 266, 267a, 269b. Either he or s. Tho. orig. mem. Wells Ch. 29 Oct. 1701. W. Hannah, ag. 28, in Ipswich ct. 30 Mar. 1680, one of many who bot stolen goods from Samuel Dutch's wife. He d. bef. 3 May 1713. Adm. ab. 1730 to son James, who had buried his mother. Ch: Mary, m. Benjamin Preble. James. Thomas. Dorcas, schoolmistress, m. 30 Jan. 1700-1 Samuel Stewart. Abigail, bap. 5 Aug. 1683 at Salem, m. 18 Oct. 1706 Stephen Wellman of Lynn. John, with small sums and clothing to James Leech, his wife and 4 ch., Jane Fursen, Wid. Mary Walford and 4 ch., servants Richard Pierce and Tho. Paine. Ch: John, m. and had ch. in 1661.

2 **BENJAMIN** (3), Hampton Falls, b. 19 Sep. 1673, d. 12 Jan. 1718. In the Ind. wars he served as scout and messenger. M. 25 Dec. 1696 Susanna Page, dau. of Francis, who m. 2d 13 Jan. 1730 John Cram. 12 ch., one **Susannah**, m. 20 July 1738 Ebenezer Webster and was grmr. of Daniel, who, contrary to the Enc. Brit., which derives his talents from his mother, Eastman, himself, in a letter to his son, credits them to his grmr. Batchelder.

3 **NATHANIEL**, ±70 in 1700, grson of (5), s. of Nathaniel and Hester (Mercer) who did not come, lived in Hampton. Deed from his grfr. in 1647. In 1653 N. B. and Nathl. Drake wit. John Redman to Saml. Fogg. Const. 1683, 9 yrs. selectman, gr. j. 1683, 92, 94, 95, 98, 99. Lists 49, 52, 54, 55a, 57, 62, 392b, 393b, 396. He m. 1st 10 Dec. 1656 Deborah Smith, dau. of John and Deborah (Parkhurst), d. 8 Mar. 1675-6; 2d 31 Oct. 1676 Mary (Carter) Wyman, wid. of John of Woburn, d. 1688; 3d 23 Oct. 1689 Elizabeth, wid. of John Knill. He d. 17 Dec. 1710. Ch. by 1st w: **Deborah**, b. 12 Oct. 1657, m. 25 Jan. 1677 Joseph Palmer. **Nathaniel**, b. 24 Dec. 1659. **Ruth**, b. 9 May 1662, m. 8 July 1684 Dea. 5 **REV. STEPHEN**, b. 1561, matric. St. John's Coll., Oxford, 17 Nov. 1581, B.A. 3 Feb. 1586-7, vicar at Wherwell, Hants, 17 July 1587 until deposed in 1605, but liv. there in 1614. Of So. Stoneham, co. Hants, in 1631, he was lic. to visit his children in Holland, but having taken up with the company of merchant adventurers called the Plough Company, he came to N. E., arriving at Cambridge in the William and Francis. 5 June 1632, ag. 71. He preached at Lynn the first yr. and was made freeman there 1635; of Ipswich in 1636 and Yarmouth 1637, failing settlement at both; Newbury 1638. In 1638-39 he was the leader in the settlement of Hampton and is said to have named the town; excommunicated there but restored. In 1641 he was 'umpire' in an important reference case in Me. In 1644 he was called to Exeter but was prohib. from preaching there by the Genl. Ct. Apr. 20, 1647, he was 'late of Hampton now of Strawberry Bank.' Lists 391a, 392a, 393b. His 1st wife may have been a Bate, a rel. to Rev. John Bate, vicar at Wherwell, who called Stephen jr. 'cousin'; he m. 2d at Abbots-Ann 2 Mar. 1623-4 Christian Weare, wid.; 3d at Abbots-Ann 26 Mar. 1627 Helena Mason, wid., ±48 in 1631, who d. bef. 3 May 1647, when Portsm., as he wrote, assigned 'an honest neighbor (a widow)' to help care for his fam.; 4th unhappily the widow, Mary Beedle (4) of Kittery, with whom in 1650 he was ordered to live. The same yr. he was charged with marrying without bans. Oct. 16, 1651, she and George Rogers were convicted; 14 Oct. 1652 she was presented for entertaining idle people on the Sabbath. She asked for divorce 18 Oct. 1656, alleg. he had gone to England

many yrs. since and mar. again, herself and two invalid ch. destitute on her hands. Lists 282, 284, 298. The date of his return to Eng. is unkn., his P.A. to Christopher Hussey was approv. by Hampton Ct. in Nov. 1654. He d. at Hackney near London ab. 1660. Ch. by 1st w: Theodate, b. 1588, m. Christopher Hussey. Nathaniel, b. 1590, merchant of Southampton, Eng., d. 1645. By w. Hester (Mercer) had 5 kn. ch: Stephen, Anna, Francis, Nathaniel (3), Benjamin. Deborah, b. 1592, m. Rev. John Wing. Stephen, b. 1594, liv. with f. at Wherwell in 1614, having been expelled from Magdalen Coll. as the author of libellous verses. Samuel, b. 1597, a minister, late of Gorcum, Holland, in 1640. Ann, b. 1600, m. 1st one Sanborn, 2d bef. 1640 Henry Atkinson of London. Mary Batchelder, ch. of his 4th w., 21 in 1671, had m. by 26 Mar. 1673 William Richards, whom the court on his petn., after delib., app. adm. of S. B.'s est.

**BATEMAN**, presumably occup., tanner's helper.

1 **EDWARD**, with John Brown, both lately of Pemaquid, bot land at Nequasset from the Ind. 1 Nov. 1639. E. B. bot out Brown's int. in 1646 and sold to James Coole in 1654. List 10. Pemaquid wit. 1657; wit. deed Damariscotta Indians to Sylvanus Davis 1659.

2 **JOHN**, brought foreclosure suit against Thos. Greenslade, Casco Ct., 1667. Likely of Boston and Hingham, 2 s. and 4 dau. named in will 1690.

**BATES**, 87th commonest name in N. E.

1 **GEORGE**, thatcher, adm. to Boston Ch. 24 Jan. 1636, dism. to Exeter 6 Jan. 1639, recd. back into Boston Ch. 31 May 1640.

2 **JOHN**, sued by Nathl. Fryer July 1673, sold house and farm in Wells to Fryer Apr. 1674, and that summer with w. Martha was abs. from meeting in Wells. List 269b.

3 **WILLIAM**, Newcastle, bot land there from Elizabeth Fabes, exec., 1704; d. bef. 1731. Ch: Mary, m. Jotham Berry 11 Nov. 1731. Judith, m. James Marden.

**BATSON**, patronym., Bartholomew.

1 **\*JOHN** (3), Cape Porpus, selectm. 1679, const. 1680, assemblyman 1682, 84. Lists 32, 256, 259; 305a. He was gr. mill priv. with Isaac Cole and Saml. York in 1681, owned half the sawmill and was found drowned under the mill wheel, inquest 3 Apr. 1685. Adm. gr. in May 1685 to wid. Elizabeth (Sanders, m. June 166-), Richard Randall her bondsman, and again in 1729-30 to grs. John Batson. Wid. Elizabeth m. 2d one Walden, adm. to Cambridge Ch. 26 May 1697 as Wid. Batson alias Goody Walden; 3d 2 Dec. 1700 John Gove of Cambridge (bro. of Edward), who d. 24 Dec.

1704, ag. ±77. She was liv. in Camb. 1725. Ch: John. Nathaniel, bp. adult Camb. 30 Jan. 1697-8, app. d.s.p. Elizabeth, m. 1st in Boston 18 Apr. 1693 John Fairfield of Ipswich, 2d in Boston 5 Dec. 1718 Dependence Littlefield of Wells. Mary, b. ab. 1676, d. in Camb. 2 Mar. 1760, ag. 83 (grst.). She m. 1st in Camb. 6 Nov. 1701 Thomas Prentice who d. 7 Dec. 1709; 6 ch. incl. Rev. Thomas Prentice of Ken'port; 2d bef. 1720 Nathaniel Robbins; 3d 24 Nov. 1742 Samuel Lyon of Roxbury. Sarah, b. ab. 1685, bp. adult Camb. 28 Feb. 1696-7, m. 12 Aug. 1714 James Reade of Camb., d. 25 Nov. 1721. 1 son who d.y.

2 **LT. JOHN** (1), ship carpenter, Me. jury 1687, was of Newcastle in 1693, N. H. jury 1697, but returned to Cape Porpus by 1698 and liv. on his father's land. With Saml. Hill of Charlestown he built a sawmill in 1699; later they took Joseph Storer as partn. Tavern 1700-1701. Lists 60, 68, 315bc, 96. K. in fight with Ind. at Black Point in Oct. 1703 (Pike), two mos. aft. his w. Anna (Odiorne), and their ch. were carried capt. to Canada. There she was bp. in the Catholic Ch. 14 Mar. 1705. She m. 2d bef. 15 Dec. 1705 a fellow captive, James Stilson; liv. Newcastle 1721. Ch: Mary, b. Newcastle 5 Feb. 1697, bp. in Canada 24 June 1704, m. Thomas Parsons; 2d Richard Tarlton. Liv. Newcastle. John, b. Newcastle 16 May 1699, bp. in Canada 18 Jan. 1705, m. Love Clark (14). He was a coaster of Newc. Ch. Clement, b. in Canada 25 Nov. 1703, bp. same day, d.y.

3 **STEPHEN**, of Saco in 1637 with w. Elizabeth bound dau. Margery to Capt. Bonython. He was of Wells by 1639 or 41, but soon at Cape Porpus, a small river there still bearing his name. His last yrs. were spent in Wells. In 1649 he wit. Wadleigh's Ind. deed; in 1662 sold 300 a. land and outfit on Stag Isl. to Peter Oliver, merch. of Boston. Lists 251, 252, 255, 269b. 'Honest Stephen Batson and his wife' Elizabeth sheltered the Quaker Edward Wharton. She was forced to retract her accus. against her husb. and her dau. Clay in 1660; the next yr. she was holding two swine that belonged to James Harmon. He d. in Wells 30 June 1676, his will 8 Mar. 1673-4 specifying son, 3 daus., grch. John Trott, and also app. grch. Sarah Ashley and Mary Trott. Ch: John. Dau., the mother of John Trott. (Dau., mother of Sarah Ashley?). Margery, apprent. to 3 masters 1637-8 (app. m. 1st William Kendall), 2d Richard Young, 3d Robert Elliot (5). Mary, m. 1st Jonas Clay (1), 2d William Brockus. Elizabeth, app. helped her parents and was given the home; m. late William Ashley (4).

**BATT**, Christopher, bp. 24 Sep. 1633 at St.

ch. bap. **Ebenezer**, named in will 1695, not aft. Ichabod, Lieut. Lists 368b, 369. Adm. 15 Dec. 1774 to wid. Temperance, his wife in 1729 and wid. down to 1786. 5 ch. \***Jonathan**, Capt., Rep. 1745. He m. 17 Nov. 1720 Mary Weeks, named in his will 4 Feb.—24 Sep. 1755. 5 ch. Daughters unkn., but presum. incl. **Lydia**, mar. 9 Jan. 1717-8 John Burnham(2).

4 **CAPT. SAMUEL**(3), selectm. in 1703 and capt. in the Port Royal exped. in 1707. Sep. 17, 1707, a lumbering crew were ambushed near his own house, and hims., br. James and perh. Ebenezer were shot down. He m. Elizabeth Smith, who m. 2d Amos Pinkham. His child. were: **Samuel**, eldest, d.s.p. 1717, by statem. of heirship in 1736. **Phillip**, d.s.p. 1720. **Joseph**, m. Hannah (Peirce), wid. of Thomas Hanson. Liv. in Dover. Both dead, adm. 5 Aug. 1740 to Reuben Chesley and Timothy Hanson. **Benjamin**, d.s.p. 1718. **Reuben**, twice m. bef. 1735 to Ann and Margaret. Liv. in Madbury; d. bef. 1790. **Lilias**, m. Isaac Watson. **Keziah**, m. Timothy Hanson.

5 **THOMAS**(2), selectm. 1688, 1695. Killed 15 Nov. 1697. He m. 22 Aug. 1663 Elizabeth Thomas, liv. 1701. Ch: **Thomas**, b. 4 June 1664, d. by 1700, adm. 5 Sep. 1704 to wid. Ann (Huntress), who had m. Joseph Daniels(4) and had d. by Jan. 1704-5. 6 ch., incl. **Samuel** b. ab. 1691, who m. his stepsis. Anne Daniels. **George**, b. 1671. **Joseph**. Will 13 Apr.—7 Jan. 1730-1. He m. 1st Hannah Buss(1), who d. in 1717, 4 ch.; 2d 18 Dec. 1717 Sarah Cutt(3), who surv. **Elizabeth**, m. 1 Oct. 1688 Col. James Davis(14). **Sarah**, m. **CHESWELL**, **Richard**, Newmarket, called 'Negro' in deeds to and from him in 1717, his 6 mark. Sons: **Wentworth**, in 1764 bot pew in meetingho. **Hopstill**, housewright, Esq., in Brewst. Ramb. called Caswell- and half-bro. of Clement March, keeper of the almshouse.

#### CHICK

**THOMAS**, in 1666 was bound to good behaviour towards Davie Hamilton's wife, —bondsman Tho. Doughty. Taxed Cochecho 1671, 1672. In 1680 he worked out 6 wks. to pay his fine for intoxic. A town gr. to Tho. Wills in 1671 for the benefit of T. C.'s ch. was laid out 1719-20 to Richard C., Tho. C. jr., John Holman or Holmes and Tho. Weed. Coroner's jury 1668. List 298. He poss. had an earlier wife, but m. by 1674 Elizabeth Spencer, who m. 2d by 1693 Nicholas Turbet. Ch: **Elizabeth**, in 1683 (last ment.) was assigned her mo.'s share in her grmo. Spencer's lands, subject to use of her parents.

**Richard**, eldest son, m. 11 July 1702 Martha Lord. Lists 290, 296-298. Will 1735—1737 names 8 ch., one of them Winnefred. Parkes's land for life supp. Gr.j. 1688. Lists 96 (p. 81), 296, 298. K. by Ind. 28 Sep. 1691, adm. to wid. 9 Feb. 1691-2. He m. Sarah Nason who m. 2d 10 Nov. 1695 John Hoyt. Although the Court allowed her account as late as 4 Oct. 1726, 'to bringing up intestate's four children,' only two are cert. kn: **Sarah**, b. 26 Oct. 1680, mar. 20 May 1708 Philip Dore. **William**, mason, Berwick and Stratham. **CHUBB**. 1 **Ebenezer**, late soldier at New Casco fort 1711, sergeant 1722.

3 **CAPT. PASCO**, commandant at Pemaquid in 1696, outraged English pride by surrendering the fort without firing a gun. List 127. He had been Lt. under Andros, and as Captain, with Ant. - 2 **CHARLES**, York, arrived ab. the time Thos. Trafton came over, the two suppos. linked with Newlyn, co. Cornwall, tho the York Charles, ±50 in 1681, was not the one who m. Anne Traughton (Trafton) in Newlyn in 1644 nor their s. Charles, bp. 1649. York gr. next Dodovah Hull 18 May 1667; O. A. Mar. 1679-80. Sued by Arthur Beale in 1679 and ord. to pay for 7 weeks service performed by Hannah Wakeley. A sea capt. (Dr. Banks says), but in his last yrs. he was connected with the Saywards and their mills; in 1680 he and John Mitchell (see 6) were defts. in one of several suits brot by Abel Porter, atty. for Clarke & Curwin; the next yr. they and Samuel Sayward, ano. deft., sued, charging false imprisonment. Liv. 4 June 1683 (Y. D. 3: 125; 8: 234); inv. 24 Sept. 1684; adm. to Robt. Young. No kn. fam. His gr. was sold by Joseph Young, Jr., in 1717.
