#### FIRST GENERATION

This second volume of The Morrill Kindred in America takes up the four sons of Abraham<sup>1</sup> Morrill and his wife Sarah Clement, who had issue. Two sons Aaron<sup>2</sup> and Richard<sup>2</sup> died in infancy.

Abraham<sup>1</sup> Morrill came to Boston from England in the "Lion," arriving there Sept. 16, 1632, m. Sarah Clement of Haverhill June 10, 1645, d. at Roxbury June 20, 1662. Buried in the "Old First Burying Place," Roxbury, Mass.

Sarah (Clement) Morrill, namely Capt. Jacob<sup>2</sup>, 1648-1718, and his wife Susannah Whittier, and the fourth son Lieut. Moses<sup>2</sup> and his wife Rebecca Barnes, are carried out, as to the male lines, for each of the succeeding generations as fully as has been possible to gather data. The third son, Abraham<sup>2</sup> jr., 1652-1698, and his wife Sarah Bradbury had but one son who died in infancy.

A "Friend," "Householder" of S., took the Oath of Allegiance and Fidelity 1677, signed Petition of 1680, Freeman 1690, "Jacob Morall's garrison" mentioned 1691, was soldier at Wells 1696, Jacob and Susannah signed the Bradbury Petition of 1692.

4. ABRAHAM<sup>2</sup> (Abraham<sup>1</sup>), b. Nov. 14, 1652, S., d. 1697-8, fell in a fainting fit at the home of Jacob Bradbury, and was fatally burned. He took the Oath of Allegiance 1677, also Oath of Fidelity, m. Sarah Bradbury about 1688, S., b. Feb. 26, 1661-2, d. March 5, 1708-9, dau. of Wymond Bradbury<sup>2</sup>, (Thomas<sup>1</sup>) and his wife Sarah Pike, he d. April 7, 1669 on the Island of Nevis, West Indies, and the widow m. 2d John Stockman, May 10, 1671, S. After the death of her father Wymond Bradbury in 1669, Sarah Bradbury was under the guardianship of her uncle, Rev. John Pike. On the death of her husband, Abraham<sup>2</sup> Morrill she was appointed to administer the estate, Sept. 28, 1696, and on her death Lieut. Moses<sup>2</sup> Morrill was appointed to administer the estate in 1709.

Mary Webster, Oct. 28, 1712, S., dau. of John Webster (John<sup>2</sup>, John Webster<sup>1</sup>), she was dead in 1732. It is said that he had a 2d wife Mary —, and removed to what is now Franklin, N. H. He was an original proprietor of Salisbury, N. H., and is buried in the part called Franklin, in the cemetery at the "Lower Village," now Webster Place, N. H. Greeley who m. Jeremiah<sup>4</sup> Morrill, son of Jacob<sup>3</sup> and Elizabeth (Stevens) Morrill. He lived in South Hampton, N. H., and Methuen, Mass. He administered the estate of Ezekiel Morrill of Methuen, grandson of Jeremiah Morrill, 1800.

Henry Morrill lived in the part of Excter, N. H., now Brentwood, and in Hawke, now Danville, N. H. He was one of the original proprietors of Salisbury, N. H., and lived there when it was called "Steventown," on "Smith's Hill." It is not known when he moved to or left Salisbury, N. H.
