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# CHILD(E) IMMIGRATION TO NEW ENGLAND

The purpose of this article is identify the Child(e) immigrants to New England prior to 1680. Another purpose is to bridge the ocean to England connecting each immigrant to the correct parents. Another purpose is to correct all the mispublished information about the Child(e) families which immigrated to New England.

This research begins with an uncle who brings seven nephews to New England. The uncle and each of the seven nephews are researched with a generation or two of their posterity linking them to Elias Child's book, Genealogy of Child, Childs, and Childe of America, published in 1881. The nephews are incorrectly linked to fictitious names such as Samuel and William Child in Elias Child'd book. Authors in the late 1800's have quoted from his book as the authority bringing many misconceptions about their orgins. Samuel and William Child are not found in any records prior to 1680. (See T.A.G. article in 1987 Vol Jan pp. 29-30. The Non-Existant William Child) After several years of research in the New England records, the immigration puzzle has been completed.

The immigration of the Childe family began in 1630 with Ephraim Childe and his wife Elizabeth. A thorough search was made of all the early records prior to 1630, with no Childe names being found. There are no other Childe names in the records until 1645, when Dr. Robert Child appears.

The immigration of Ephraim Childe to New England occurred in 1630 as recorded by Gov. John Winthrope in his journals. Ephraim Childe was a good friend of Gov. Winthrope and arrived in the Arbella along with three other boat loads of immigrants. The other boats were named the Jewell, Ambrose, and Talbot. These four boats were a part of the seventeen fleet of boats which brought 980 passengers, cows, horses, sheep and supplies to New England in 1630. Some ten thousand people immigrated in the next eighteen years to New England. Many of the immigrants settled in Watertown with their names being listed on the maps of the "Orginal Land Allotments of Watertown" Ephraim is listed in the will of Gov. Winthrope. Ephraim settled in Watertown and his name is found on the Orginal Land Allotments. (Winthrope Journals)

Ephraim Childe is found in the Early Watertown Records as a freeman, deacon and a selectman for Watertown. There are no children listed in any of the records for Ephraim and Elizabeth Childe including their wills. Their wills list some of their nephews and their wives who lived in New England after 1648.

The orginal will of Ephraim Child in his own handwriting is found in the Colonial Court Records, Folio 39-II-c as follows: 1662, November 10. Will of Ephraim Child of Watertown, Massachusetts; unto Will' Bond the father 40 akers of lands; unto Richard Child & John Child, all the rest of ye land; my deare & loving wife my dwelling house (her) maintence; Ephraim Child, the son of Beniamin Child should inherit my dwelling howse; my dear wife, & my loving Cossonn Will' Bond to be my executors. (Also names other persons in the will)

1662/3 Feb 13 Inventory of estate of Ephraim Child late of Watertown deceased. (In the listing of his land in his will) 40 akers we finde he gave to Richard Child upon his marriage...(household items listed, ect) The only dept listed is a debt from Joseph wife.

Elizabeth Child the relict widow of the above Ephraim Child dec'ed appearing in Court, 2 April 1663...(Middlesex County Probate Records, File 4401.

1667, June 11. Will of Elizebeth Child (of Watertown, names among many others) William Bond senior, Will Bond juner, Ric Childs eldest son, second son of Richard Child, Ric Childes wife, Ben Childs wife, loveing cousen William Bond senior execetor, (Middlesex PR, File 4399.) Probate 1 Oct 1667.

The identity of Ephraim Child is further explored with his name being listed in the P.C.C. will of John Bradshawe probated 6 Mar 1606/7 along with his brothers Nathaniel, Benjamin and Joshua, and his sister Elizabeth Child. John Bradshawe of Westminister married Elizabeth Empson the sister of Ellen or Hellen Empson, the mother of the above children. Ephraim was born in 1593 in Westminister, Middlesex, England as the son of Wolstan or Wolstone Child and Ellen Empson. Ephraim married on the 8th of Feb 1625 in Nayland, Suffolk, England, to Elizabeth Bond Palmer widow of Samuel Palmer. Ephraim died the 13th of Feb 1662/3 at the age 70 in Watertown, Suffolk, Mass. Elizabeth Bond Palmer Child was christened the 12th of Mar 1599 at Bury, St. Edmunds, Suffolk, England and left a will the 11th of June 1867 in Watertown, Suffolk, Mass. Ephraim and Elizabeth never had any children of their own. Ephraim was issued 42 acres of orginal Watertown land and was characterized as one of New England's most affluent settlers. He is listed as a gentleman in the London records which we will refer to later. His coat of arms is registered and listed in the American Heraldry Records along with his nephew Benjamin Child as listed in my " Childe of England" book.

The identy of Ephraim Child has been positively identified in the records of both New England and England. Probate Records, File 4401.

The second name to appear in the New England records is Dr. Robert Child in 1645. Dr. Child purchased land in New England in Massachusetts and in Maine. An investigation of his ancestory reveils that he was born the son of John Child, gentleman, of Northfleet, Kent, England who left a P.C.C. will in 1619. Dr. Robert Child was born in 1612 in Northfleet, Kent, England, graduated with a B.A., M.A., from Cambridge and in 1638 with a M.D. from Padua. He went to New England in 1644 where his theological views got him into trouble, was convicted of sedition, fined, and imprisioned. Dr. Child was released in 1647 and put aboard a ship to return to England. He was considered as a Jonah on board the ship and when a great storm arose all his papers where thrown overboard and eventually wash upon the English shore. Robert went to Ulster, Ireland in 1652, and died near Belfast in 1654. (P.C.C. will of John Child, Kent, England, probated 1619)(Dict. of National Biography of Robert Child M.D.)

The English Civil War broke out in England in 1642 between the Protestant Parliament and King Charles I. Parliament convicted the King for treason for having Protestants killed for their religious beliefs. The King led his army against the Protestants led by Sir Oliver Cromwell. From 1642 through 1645 Sir Oliver Cromwell defeated the King and his forces in every battle. King Charles I escaped to Scotland but was returned to Parliament in 1648. Sir Oliver Cromwell rode into Parliament and captured the King and imprisoned him in the Tower of London. indepentant laywers headed by John Bradshaw Three tried King Charles I and found him guilty of treason and had him beheaded in 1649. Sir Oliver Cromwell took over the government in 1649 as Lord Protectorate. Sir Oliver Cromwell ruled England from 1649-1658. He died in 1658 and was suceeded by his son Sir Richard Cromwell until 1660, when Charles II was put in power.

During the winter of 1648 Ephraim Child returned to London and found the country in a civil war. Even the Protestant groups were fighting amoung themselves and eventually they fractioned three groups. Finding the atmosphere unsafe in England into during his visit with his brothers families and his sister Elizabeth Foote, Ephraim Childe devised a plan to bring his nephews to New England where it was safe. Ephraim Childe visited his sister Elizabeth Foote and convinced her to lend him 100 pounds to bring his nephews to New England. Proof of this plan is the arrival of Benjamin Childe and Ephraim Childe together in New England in the fall of 1648. (History of Roxbury p.93) The other nephews also are found in New England records starting in 1649.(Barnstable Co. financial Records) A record of this transaction is recorded as follows:

1647/8 March 15. Indenture between Ephraim Childe of Watertown in New England, Gentleman, and Elizabeth Foote of London, Widdowe. Ephraim Childe for one hundred pounds paid by the said Elizabeth Foote hath sold unto the said Elizabeth Foote All that messuage or tenem't with the Barnes stables, outhouses, orchards yards gardens and apperteinces thereunto belonging, in Watertown in New England in pits beyond the seas, Fiftie acres of meadow & pasture ground abutting north and east on the highwaye there, south on the land of John boardman and west on the lands of John lovering, And one hundred and Fiftie acres of arrable

land being inclosed Abutting north on the highewaie, South on the Watertown River, and East & west uppon other land of the said Ephraim Childe All said premisses being in Watertown aforesaid. To have to hold the said Messuage or Tenem't unto the said Elizabeth Foote From the daie of the date unto the full term of Fower score & Nineteene years, (she) paieing yearely during the said terme unto the said Ephraim Childe one Corne or graine of pepper on the Feast daie of the Birth of o'r Lord God in everie if the same be lawfully demanded. Provided That the said yeare. Ephraim Childe paie unto the said Elizabeth Foote At or in the now house of Robert Scr(ivener) in Towerstreet London the sume of One hundred and eight pounds on the Seventeen daie of March in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and Fortie & Eight (1648) That then this Indenture be void ... (signed) Ephraim Child.

Elizabeth Foote was well off financially and loaned her brother Ephraim Childe 100 pounds. For security Ephraim gave Elizabeth a mortgage deed to property he owned in Watertown. A deponent who witnessed the signing of the document stated that Ephraim Child put his signature to it in London, 15 March 1647/8. This document is recorded as follows:

(Deposition) John Maxfeild of the p'ish of St John Baptist upon Walbrooke London Scrivener aged Thirty and Five yeares or thereabouts maketh oath and deposeth that the within written Indenture was sealed and delivered by the within named Ephraim Childe in the presence of this deponent. John Maxfield. Ind Decicme septo die Martii (17 March) 1664 (1664/5). (Original document found by Robert Charles Anderson, F.A.G.S., in the Middlesex County, Massachusetts, Colonial County Court Papers, Folio 39-II-c (hereafter Colonial Court). The signature of Ephraim Child matches that on his will, abstracted further on.)

Ephraim Childe returned from England in 1648 with as many of his nephews as the 100 pounds would give passage. These nephews included 1. William Bond, son William Bond Sr., son of Jonas Bond, 2. Benjamin Childe son of Rev. Benjamin Childe, Vicar of Cottesbatch, Leicester, 3. Joseph, 4. Richard, and 5. John Child sons of Joshua Childe, 6. Richard and 7. John Child sons of Nathaniel Childe of Westminister. These nephews will be treated in order that they are found in the New England records with references to English references upon establishing their identity.

Ephraim Childe made no payments on the loan to his sister Elizabeth Foote. After Ephraim died in 1662/3 Elizabeth gave the power of attorney to her son-in-law William Goddard to collect the debt. The date of the power of attorney is 13 April 1665, empowering William to retrieve the debt, sell the land or do what ever he had to do. This power of attorney is recored as follows:

1665, April 13. Power of attorney: To all xpain (Christian) people to whom this pr'sent writtinge shall come Elizabeth Foote of London widdowe sendeth Greetinge Whereas Ephraim Childe of Water towne in Newe England Gent by his Indenture bearinge date the fifteenth day of March in the yeare of our Lord One Thousand six hundred Forty and Seaven, did for the consideration of One hundred pounds sell unto the said escription as in the previously quoted indenture) And became bound unto her the said Elizabeth Foote in the penall summe of Two hundred pounds condic'oned for the true payment of the summe of One hundred and eight pounds upon the said seaventeenth day of March One Thousand six hundred forty and eight Which said summe Capitall Messuage lands in the Said Indenture are become forfeited unto her the said Elizabeth Foote therefore the said Elizabeth Foote hath appointed her welbeloved freind and sonne in Lawe William Goddard of London aforesaid Grocer her true and lawfull Attorney for her and in her name.

The third Childe in New England is Benjamin Childe found in the records in 1648. From the History of Roxbury p.93, "Benjamin Child. His name occurs in 1648. He had land in the town and his name is in the transcripts, but he belonged to Muddy River. In 1672, he was one of those who contributed for the building the church (2nd). His wife Mary was admited to the church in 1658." Roxbury was in the Muddy River area where Benjamin is found in the records. Muddy River was the projection of land between the James and the Charles Rivers which later became known as Brookline. Muddy River is located two miles inland from the ocean, and Boston, and across the river from Roxbury.

Benjamin Childe had 80 acres of land in Roxbury in the fall of 1648. The Childe homestead was built on a hill overlooking the land. Today, there is a park where part of the orginal property was farmed. In 1700 a church was established known as the Brookline Church. Prior to that time the people crossed the river and worshipped at Roxbury where the records of Benjamin Childe's family are found, beginning in 1658. Benjamin had worshipped there from 1648. Benjamins wife Mary and the three oldest children were baptized in Roxbury on the 27th of Feb 1658. (Brookline Records, History of Roxbury p.93,195, Roxbury Vital Records.)

Benjamin Childe's property ajointed Griffith Bowen's property of 150 acres whom he helpped farm. Benjamin Childe fell in love with Griffith Bowen's daughter Mary and the happy couple were married in 1653 in Boston. The exact date of marriage wasn't recorded as the Boston Marriage Records begin in 1663. (History of Roxbury D.195)

Benjamin Childe is found in the records witnessing a deed as follows. "Deed of Joseph Patchin of Roxbury, 16 day 9th month 1651,witnessed by Benjamin Child". (Suffolk Deeds)

The property of Benjamin Childe is described in the Vital Records of Roxbury, Mass. Benjamin Childe's estate was between Bowen and Witney's property and the Brookline boundry. "The Whitney property was purchased by the Childe family in later years, whose premise it joined on the East. In the rear of the spot where the old house stood, the round slopes gradually downward for several rod to a little brook. Beyond the meadow the ground rises abruptly to an elevation many feet higher than the from lot, and still rises graually, forming a slope of considerable dimentions, and extending westerly to Brookline. West of the brook is a fine grove of forest trees. Benjamin's farm was West of the Griffin Bowen estate of 150 acres in Roxbury, Suffolk County.(also see History of Roxbury p.93)

The town of Muddy River granted "2. 3mo 1659/60 to its Constables one month more to clear their accots... then to be discharged and to succeed them in their places Ben Childs for Muddy River and Jno Grover for Rumney March." (History of Roxbury p.195)

In the Vital Records of Roxbury are found the decendants of Benjamin Childe and his wife Mary Bowen. The first three children were baptized with their mother Mary on the 27th of Feb 1658 in Roxbury.

The establishment of the identity of Benjamin Childe in Muddy River and Roxbury, Mass. has now been completed with the execption of his birth and death. The birth and parents identity comes from the English records. Benjamin Childe was born in Cottesbach, Leicester, England as the son of Vicar Benjamin Childe, B.A., M.A., Clerk, and parson of Cottesbatch. Benjamin's mother was Sarah Shenton of Crofts, Leicester. Benjamin was the 2nd child and first son baptized in Cottesbatch. The children's baptism dates are recorded in the Cottesbatch Parish Register #1 as follows.

1629

Sept 4th was baptized Elizabeth ye daughter of Benjamin Child Rr. of Cottesbatch."

1631

Januarie 15 was baptized Benjamin ye sonne of Benjamin Child Rr.

1634, 28/9 Sep baptized Nathanaell Child son of Benjamin.

When Benjamin was only three years old his father died leaving Sarah his mother to raise him. Sarah Shenton Childe, widow of Rev. Benjamin Childe, remarried in 1647 to John Bradshaw of Darcy Lever, Lancaster. Sarah and John Bradshaw are listed in the 1664 Visitation of Lancaster-Bradshaw of Darcy Lever, p.51. Elizabeth Childe, daughter of Rev. Benjamin Childe and Sarah is also listed as marrying James Bradshaw son of the above John Bradshaw.

Savage, in his Genealogical Dictionary of New England p.377-

8 summerizes Benjamin Childe as follows: "Benjamin, Roxbury, probably nephew of Ephraim here, son of Benjamin in England, may rather be called of Boston, as he lived in Muddy River Plantation, now Brookline, but worshipped at Roxbury 1648, by wife Mary, adm. into the Church of Roxbury 23 Jan 1658/9. (He also lists his twelve children and their baptismal dates.)

We learn from Savage and the History of Roxbury that Benjamin Child was the son of Benjamin Childe in England and that he was in New England in 1648 and made his home in Roxbury and Muddy River. Benjamin Childe did indeed immigrate to New England in 1648.

From John Bradshawe's P.C.C. will of 6 March 1606/7 we learn that Ephraim, Benjamin , Joshua and Nathaniel Childe were brothers in England makes Benjamin Childe the younger a nephew of Ephraim Childe.

The death of Benjamin Childe the younger is recorded in the Roxbury Vital Records-deaths area, as the 14 Oct 1678. The identity of Benjamin Childe has been established in English records and Roxbury, Mass. records.

Richard Child(e) of Barnstable and Marshfield, Mass.

The second nephew which Ephraim Childe brought to New England in 1648 is Richard Child. Richard is found in the New England records in 1649 and in no record prior to that date in New England. In the Barnstable, Barnstable Co. Records is found the marriage of Richard Child to Mary Linnell on 15 Oct 1649. Mary Linnell was the daughter of Robert Linnell of Barnstable who left a will dated 12 Mar 1662/3 which names all the living children except Mary who had died prior to this time. Robert Linnell died 23 Jan 1662/3 with seven children. (Barnstable, Barnstable, Mass. Records)

Richard Child was born in 1624 as recorded in the New England Marriages Prior to 1700 p.150-1, in Westminister, Middlesex, England as the son of Nathaniel Childe and Isabell Treadway. Nathaniel Child is found in the will of John Bradshaw P.C.C March 1606/7 along with with brothers Benjamin, Ephraim, Joshua, and his sister Elizabeth Child (Miles, Foote). Nathaniel's marriage to Isabell Tredway is found in the St. Martin Parish records of Westminister, Middlesex on 4 June 1621. Three children have been identified at present, Mary born May 1623 and died Dec 1627; Richard born 1624, and John born 1626. Both Richard and John immigrated to New England in 1648 with uncle Ephraim Child. John Child will be treated later with his descendants in Boston, Mass. (New England Marriages have Richard b. 1624.; Salem Quarterly Court Records Vol VII pp179-189; John was abt 25 in 1653)

There are two children born to Mary Linnell and Richard Child that we can find in the records. The first child born in Barnstable was Samuel Child being born about 1651 and killed by Indians 26 Mar 1675 during King Phillips War, at the battle of Rehoboth with five others including Samuel Linnell. The second child born at Barnstable was Richard Child, born abt 1653. Richard married in 1678 to Elizabeth Crocker daughter of John Crocker. Elizabeth was born 07 Oct ^1660 and died 15 Jan 1696. Her mother's name was Mary Bodfish (Botfish). John Crocker was the son of William and Elizabeth Crocker. (Barnstable County Records)

Sometime between 1653 and 1661 Mary Linnell Child died leaving Richard with two small children to raise. Richard began to look for some help to raise the boys. He applied for cottage rights at Yardmouth 05 Mar 1661 and was denied these rights until he signed an agreement. Freeman states that Richard was "allowed to enjoy his cottage" after signing a hold-harmless agreement that placed his present children out of town responsibility. Evidentily, Mary had died by this time and the towns people didn't want the responsibility of raising the children. There is no evidence that any children were born at Yardmouth. (Yardmouth, Barnstable Records)

In reviewing the Marshfield Plymouth County records there is no Child in any of the records until Richard Child appears in From the Marshfield, Mass. Records I find that Richard 1664/5. Child found another wife and moved there. He retained his house and property in Barnstable which his son Richard inherited and started the Child Barnstable lineage there. (Barnstable Vital Records) The Marshfield Records state that Richard Child married Mary Truant on 24 Jan 1664/5. Mary was the daughter of Morris and Jane Truant married at Plymouth 16 Oct 1639. Morris Truant was first noted at Marshfield in Aug 1654 when Miles Standish and John Alden solved a property line dispute for him. Richard Child and Mary Truant lived at Marshfield where they had four children: Joseph born in 1667, married Elizabeth Seabury and left a will in 1718 Marshfield #3879 of the Plymouth Co. Probate Index by Wood. Jane Child was born 1669 in Marshfield, Benjamin Child was born about 1671 and left an Administration in 1709 Marshfield #3877. Samuel Child was born about 1676 and buried in 1681. Richard's line is printed out in Elias Child's book, Genealogy of Child, Childs, and Childe of America. The beginning of the line 18 totally incorrect as are most of Elias Child's early immigration connections. That is the main reason all this research has taken place to correct the previously published incorrect material.

The life of Richard Child of Barnstable and Marshfield came to an end in 1691 when he died. His estate settlement is dated 15 Sep 1691, mentions widow Mary, eldest son Joseph, and witness Hannah Truant. The family had but a few of the necessary possessions and both ladies signed with a mark. Administration #3880 Marshfield, Plymouth Co. Probate Index by Wood.

The third nephew of Ephraim Childe brought to New England in 1648 was John Child. John is the brother of the above Richard Child and son of Nathaniel and Isabell Tredway Childe. John was born in 1626 in Westminister, Middlesex, England. The Salem Quarterly Court Records and Files p. 179 have him testifying in court in 1653 during September. "Mr. Francis Buers, assignee for John Bis v. Capt Thomas Breedon, for his part of the money for which the ship Happy Entrance was sold to him. Mr. John Child, aged about 25 years, deposed that Rich: Margeram, master of the good ship called Happy Entrance, did in the presence of Worshipful Governor of New England say that Lt. Thomas Morice, Henry Cowes, Ffrancs: Buers ect, 1653, Files."

On the bottom of the same page is a second entry." Mr. William Phillips v. John Child and Patrick Conaway. For attaching his goods in the hands of Mr. William Browne. A search of the Salem records revieled no other Child entries for over a hundred years.

John is next found in Boston where he married and raised a family. He evidently married 1st to \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and the date is estimated abt 1644 as his first son was born in 1645. This would place him marrying in England prior to the immigration to New England. There are two children by his first marriage found in the Boston and Swansey records. the first child was Jeremiah Child born about 1645 in England prior to the 1648 immigration with Ephraim Childe. Jeremiah's oath of allegience was taken in Boston in 1678. A son Jeremiah was born in 1672 at Swansey.

An oath of allegience wouldn't be taken on an 6 year old child. Oaths were taken on men of age (21) of accountability when turning 21 years old or older if immigrating to New England. I therefore estimate his year of birth as 1645 in England. Jeremiah Child married Martha \_\_\_\_\_\_abt 1670 at Swansey where he went to live. Jeremiah was a freeman 1 June 1680, a selectman 1682, and married Elizabeth Thurber Eastbrook after Martha died. (Early Boston Records & Swansey Records)

The second son of John Child is Alwin Child born about 1647 in England. Alwin is found in the Boston Tax Records in 1678 as an adult but it is not known what happened to him. The third child of John Child is Thomas Child born about 1670 in Boston, of the second marriage. John Child married second to Ann \_\_\_\_\_\_about 1669 in Boston. Ann was the widow of John Wakefield who died in 1667. Thomas married Katherine Masters 14 Apr 1688 in Boston, Suffolk, Mass. John Child Sr. died 1683-5 in Boston, Suffolk, Mass. (See New England Marriages and Boston Vital Records.)

The fourth, fifth, and sixth nephews brought to Watertown, Mass. by Ephraim Child in 1648 with the 100 pounds lent to him by his sister Elizabeth Foote are brothers. Their father is provided for in the will of John Bradshaw P.C.C. 6 Mar 1606/7 as Joshua Child. Joshua Childe was christened on St. Mary Whitechurch, Stephaney, Middlesex, England as the son of Wolstan Childe and his wife Ellen or Helen Empson Childe. Joshua was married in 1628 in London, London to Joshua . Childe had four children Joseph, Richard, Mary, and John. Richard, and John were the nephews brought to Watertown Joseph, by Ephraim Childe. Joseph was born in 1629 St. Ethelburga. London, England and married in 1654 to Sarah Platt, in Watertown, Suffolk, Mass. (Vital Records of Watertown Vol 1&2) Joseph and Sarah had a son Joseph Jr.b.7 Nov 1658 in Watertown carrying on the Child name. The second son Richard Child was born 1631 in London and immigrated in 1648 with uncle Ephraim. Joseph and Richard Child took the oath of fidelity in Watertown in 1652 and 1653. Richard married Mehitable Dimmich 30 Mar 1662 and had several children being one of the prominent citizens of

Watertown. The children of Richard and Mehitable are as follows:

Richard b. 30 Mar 1663 d. 04 Nov 1690, Ephraim b.09 Aug 1664 d. 02 Dec 1664, Shuball b. 19 Oct 1665, and Experience b. 26 Dec 1669, and Mehettible who md 08 Jul 1691 to Edward Garfield. Mehitable was from Barnstable, Mass. Mary was born in 1634 and 1636 in London. The third son John, Child was born in 1636 in London immigrated in 1648 with uncle Eprhraim to Watertown. John married in 1662 to Mary \_\_\_\_\_\_ and died in 1676 John Sr. married 2nd to Mary Warren granddaughter of John Warren. John Child Sr. took prominent part in the affairs of the colony, and Mary's children were born in Watertown: Mary b. 8 Jan 1663; 1670, and Daniel b. 5 June 1677, md 29 Jan 1702 Beriah Bemis (History of Watertown & Watertown Vital Records Vol 1&2)

The seventh nephew which I named first, was William Bond, son of William Bond Sr, and nephew of Elizabeth Bond Childe, wife Bond Sr. and a William Bond Jr. Ephraim Childe calls William Bond the father in his will giving him 40 acres of land and making him his executor.

We see positive evidence of seven nephews that appear in 1648 or later as they became old enough to appear in the records. These nephews all started families in New England due to the efforts of uncle Ephraim Childe of Watertown using his sister's 100 pounds to bring them to Watertown in 1648. This article should clarify the paternity of the seven nephews of Ephraim 1800's about them.

BENJAMIN CHILDE of Cottesbatch, Leicester of Muddy River, Roxbury, Mass.

Benjamin Childe was born in Cottesbatch, Leicester as the son of Vicar. Benjamin Childe, B.A., M.A. Clerk and Parson of Cottesbatch. Benjamin's mother was Sarah Shenton of Crofts, Leicester. Benjamin was the 2nd child and first son baptized in Cottesbatch. The children's baptism dates are recorded in the Cottesbatch Parish Registar #1 as follows.

"1629

Sept 4th was baptized Elizabeth ye daughter of Benjamin Child Rr. of Cottesbatch."

1631

Januarie 15 was baptized Benjamin ye sonne of

Benjamin Child Rr. 1634, 2879 Sep baptized Nathanaell Child son of Benjamin. When Benjamin was only three years old his father and died and was buried 5 Nov 1634 in Cottesbatch. Benjamin's mother raised the threchildren in Cottesbatch with interest in a bakery in Bitteswell, Leicester ... Benjamin went to school and was educated in the Leicester schools. The Child family went to church in the Cottesbatch Parish and worshiped with the other members.

In 1641 Sarah Child sold her interest in the bakery in Bitteswell, Leicester. The Child family evidently sought employment in Lancaster where both Elizabeth and Sarah Child came into contact with the family of John Bradshawe. Elizabeth and Sarah, widow of Benjamin, married a son-father team of Rev. James and Gent. John Bradshaw of Darcy Lever in 1647, in Wigan Lancaster, where Rev. James Bradshawe was the Rector.

Benjamin Childe being a seventeen year old teenager didn't like the new marriage arrangement since he now had to mind a new dad. Benjamin had only a mother since he was three years old and grew up an independant lad. Sarah had probably corresponded with Ephraim Child her brother-in-law now in Watertown, Mass. Ephraim probably suggested that Benjamin come to New England where the colonization of the New World was exciting. The arrangements were made with Benjamin Child emigrated to Watertown, Mass. in 1648.

Benjamin Childe stayed but a short time with his uncle Ephraim Child in Watertown. In 1648 Benjamin Child is found purchasing property in Muddy River. Muddy River was inland two miles from Boston and across the James River from Roxbury. The Child homestead was near Jamaica Pond within the limits of Muddy River. Muddy River is in the middle. of Boston City limits today. Muddy River became known as Brookline where a church was established in 170C . Until that time the people

including Benjamin Child went across the James River to worship at Roxburby where Benjamin first worshiped in 1648.

In Muddy River Plantation Benjamin Child bought a farm of 80 acres over the years from 1648 until his death in 1678. Benjamin Child's estate was between Whitney's orginally and the Brookline boundary. "The property was purchased by the Child family, whose premise it joined. In the rear of the spot where the old house stood, the round slopes gradually downward for several rods to a narrow strip of meadow, through which runs a pleasant little brook. Beyond the meadow the ground rises abruptly to an elevation many feet higher than/the from lot, and still rises gradually, forming a slope of considerable dimentions, and extending westerly to Brookline. West of the brook is a fine grove of forest trees. Benjamin's farm was east of the Griffin Bowen estate of 150 acres and Boston, between the Muddy River and the Charles River." Vital Records of Roxbury, Mass

Benjamin Child is found in the records witnessing a deed as follows. " Deed of Joseph Patchin of Roxbury, 16 day 9th month 1651 witnessed by Benjamin Child"

Benjamin Child crossed the river to attend church at Roxbury. Benjamin Child and his decendants are found in the parish registar of Roxbury, Benjamin retained the British "e" on the surname Child, spelled Childe. Benjamin and his children are listed under Childe. Most of the next generation is also listed with the 'e' on Childe in the decendants of Benjamin and Grace Morriss Childe. The last three children of Benjamin and Grace Child have the "e" dropped from the name Child. From this point the name became Child in the official records as Benjamin was buried without the "e". The Child family carried out the names of Benjamin, Ephraim, Joshua, William, John, and Richard for hundreds of years.

In Muddy River Benjamin Child became acquainted with his neighbor Griffith Bowen. Griffith's farm ajointed Benjamin's farm of eighty acres. Griffith Bowen emigrated from Langeuith. Glamorgan. Wales in 1638, with his wife Margaret Flemming. son Henry and daughter Mary Bowen. Griffith or Griffin Bowen was an esquire born of the royal Welch family. Griffith became a freeman 22 May 1639. Mary was born in Gower, Glamorgan, Wales in 1635/6 and died 31 Oct 1717. Griffith Bowen worshiped in Boston and Roxbury where several of his later children appear on the parish registar. After living many years in Roxbury in the year of 1649. Griffith Bowen went back to London, England where he died in 1670.

Benjamin Childe fell in love with Mary Bowen daughter of Griffith Bowen. The happy couple were married in Boston in 1653 as their first child was born in 1654. A complete search was made of all the early records for the marriage date of Benjamin and Mary. It appears that their marriage date was not recorded as the Boston marriages. begin in 1663. The marriage date is not recorded in the Watertown parish registareither. It would be safe to say that they would be married in Boston, Suffolk, Mass since Boston emcompasses Mucdy River, Brockline, and Roxbury and in the area both Benjamin and Griffith Bowen lived.

The town of Muddy River granted "2. 3mo 1659/60 to its Constables one month more to clear their accots... then to be discharged and to succeed them in their places Ben Childs for Muddy River and Jno Grover for Rumney March." (Brookline Records)

"Benjamin Child was methodical and exact in his habits. Legal manuscripts of his, now in the possession of some of his heirs, attest his familiarity with affairs and fine standing in the community." (Child genealogy)

Benjamin Childe named his eldest son after his uncle Ephraim Child who emigrated to Watertown in 1630. Benjamin names his sons and daughters after the rest of his uncles, aunts and cousins both in England and New England carrying on a family tradition of names for generations to come.

Ephraim Child who was born in 1654 in Muddy River, Suffolk, Mass was called upon to help fight the Indians which had plagued the settlers in recent years by attacking the settlements. As a group of the colonists were engaged in battle with the Indians, Ephraim was killed. Ephraim was killed by the Indians in Northfield, Mass at the age of 21 on 23 Sep 1675. The heir to Benjamin's property decended to the 2nd son Benjamin Child.

"After Griffith Bowen's death, and before his estate was distributed, Benjamin Child occupied the farm of his later father-in-law, for which he paid rent L7; while there was extended for necessary reparations ,"5L. (Settlement of Griffith Bowen's estate)

Benjamin Child died on 14 Oct 1678 in Roxbury, Suffolk, Mass. His inventory was worth 506.19L Mary Bowen Child died 31 Oct 1707 at night. This is an account of the inventory of Benjamin Childe.

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### Wolstone CHILDE of Fenstaton & London

Wolstan Childe was born about 1572 in Fenstanton, Huntingdon as the son of Thomas Childe and Johanna or Joan Addams. Joan Adams was from St. Ives Parish, Huntingdon where the name of Wolstan was popular.

The name Wolstan orginates from two brothers who were lords of Yaxley, Huntingdon during King Edgars reign. (1090-1109) Wulfstan held twenty houses and his brother Aelfric Child held twenty-five houses in the manor of Yaxley which endowed the Abbey of Thorney. (Victoria County History of Huntingdon Vol 2 p.241) From Dugdales Monasticon Angicanm Vol 2 pp 598-599 dealing with Thorney Monastery, I find Wulstano, Wudestan, Wulstan with his brother AEfric Child subscribing to the establishment of the Thorney Monastery by giving them the two Yaxleys they held. In the records I find Wolstone Wulstan, Wolfstan, Wolstain, and Wolstan as variations of spelling of his name. Evidently, Wulfstan Child was a legend passed down in history which caused families in the Huntingdonshire to name their sons after Wolstan as the most common variation emerged. Besides Wolstan Childe, I found a Wolstan Chiverly, and a Wolstan Randall all from the St. Ives Parish Huntingdon. The name of Wolstan is found only in the Huntingdonshire families.

Wolstan Childe grew up in Fenstanton, Huntingdon where his father Thomas Childe inherited the Fenstanton Childe estate from his father the Rev. Richard Childe, Clerk of Fenstanton Parish. Thomas Childe's older brothers Richard and William, both moved out of Fenstanton leaving Thomas, the 3rd son, the heir of the estate.

Wolstan was the eldest son in the family with younger brothers and sisters. Thomas Childe Jr. remained in Fenstanton where he left a will in 1619. Wolstan left home and sought his livelyhood in Westminister between 16 and 17 years of age. He evidently worked as an apprentice shoemaker working to learn a skill and a trade. While in Westminister Wolstan met the lovely Ellen Empson who was christened the daughter of Thomas Empson on 21 Sep 1570 in St. Margaret Parish, Westminister. Thomas Empson and Amy Ymal were married in St. Margaret, Westminister on 5 Nov 1564.

Ellen Empson and Wolstone Child were married 4 May 1590 in Chalfont St. Peter, Buckingham. The entry in the orginal parish register has the names of the bride and groom spelled "Wolfstone Childe and Elen Empsone." (Chalfont St. Peter Parish Reg.) This spelling reflects the spelling of the Wolfstone Childe of Yaxley, Huntingdon living during the reign of King Edgar about 1100. The location of the wedding was a surprise, but perhaps Wolstan's uncle Richard Childe was then a rector in Buckingham and later in St. Katherine by the Tower in London. (Visitation of Oxford 1574, Buckingham 1574 and London 1568 for Richard Childe-College of Arms London) The vocation of Wolstan Childe was found in the Harleian Society's Register for St. Helen Bishopsgate as follows:

" Elizabeth, d. of Wolstan Childe, Cordwaynor, and Hellen his wife baptized 25 November 1599"

A cordwaynder is a shoemaker, or one who made leather goods except sadles. The cordwayners company was organized as a group in 1590 in London with arms and crest as follows:

"Arms: Azure, a chevron or between three goats's heads erased argent horned or. Crest: On a torse a goat's head erased argent, horns and beard or."

The cordwynders company's records begin in 1595. They are organized with various orders beginning with the Order of Livery, Quarteridge of the yeomanery, Freeman coblers, free coblers, the other of the company, and the Quartridge of the Journeyman. There were also Fines of the Court, payments, receipts and ect.

Wolstan Childe was found four times in the Cordwainers Records as follows:

In these records I find that Wolstan Childe was a member of the order of the Quarteridge of the yeomanery. Wolstan's apprentice was his brother-in law Thomas Empson. A second profession for Wolstan is listed in 1598-a Chandler. A Chandler is one who makes or sells candles and small wares. The cordwayner profession was continued as Wolstan is mentioned as being a cordwaynor in the parish register in 1599.

In the parish register of St. Hellens Bishopgate is found another entry that ties the Child, Bradshaw and Empson families together. There appears two of the baptisms of John and Elizabeth (Empson) Bradshaw listed as follows: "baptized 3 February 1599: Job, son of John Bradshawe gent, and Elizabeth his wyfe, from Wolstan Childes house.

baptized, 13 May 1602: Abraham, s. of John Bradshawe, gent."

From these records we learn that John and Elizabeth Bradshawe went to Wolstan Chile's house in February of 1599 from which Job Bradshawe was baptized. Evidently John went to show their new son to Wolstan and Ellen and Wolstan talked them into having him baptized. The visit also shows the love and bond between the two families which was also exibited in John Bradshawe's will of 1606.

In the P.C.C. will of John Bradshave probated on 6

March 1606/7, John names his sisters (sister in law) children in preference to naming all his seven children. John gives to Nathaniel, Benjamin, Ephraim, Joshua, and Elizabeth Child and Abigail Warren, children of my sister Warren 10 shillings apiece"

During this interum Wolstan Childe had died and his wife Ellen or Hellen had remarried to a Warren. The death of Wolstan Childe isn't recorded in St Hellen's as Wolstan switched Parishes to St. Ethelburga without Bishopsgate, London between 1599 and 1601. Wolstans Administration is found in the Archdeaconry Court of London Administrations on # 142 as follows:

March was the first month of the year before the calendar was corrected. Wolstan Childe died before 7 March 1601 when his estate was administered in the courts. His wife is called Hellen in the Administration whereas Ellen and Hellen were used interchangeable as names.

In Boyd's Pedigee's of Citizens of London Wolstan Childe is listed in the index as a citizen, cordwainer, but did not have his pedigree nor children listed on a separate page.

The P.C.C. Acts of the Administration index on page 134 list the following: "Warren, Edward, St. Botolph without Aldgate, London, to Benjamin Child, maternal half brother of Abigail Warren daughter, during her minority. Adm. 26 Sep 1616" p. 84

The children of Wolstan Childe and Elen or Helen Empson were born between 4 May 1590 and 7 Mar 1601 when Wolstan's estate was settled in the Archdeaconry Ct. of London.

Nathaniel, Bnejamin and Ephraim were all born in Westminister, but their dates of christening and exact birthdates wern't recorded as Wolstone and Ellen never went to church. Not until their son John died in 1595 did they decide to go to church and have their last two children baptized. They even talked John Bradshawe into having his children baptized as found in the parish register.

Where Wolstan Childe was burie is presumed St. Ethelburga, London since his administration was probated in St. Ethelburga. Since there are no parish records prior to 1666 in St. Ethelburga the burial date has probably been lost forever. A search of the London published burials did not include any Wolstan Childe entries.

The following entries are found in the St. Botolph without Aldgate Parish Burial records.

- 1602 Symon Warren sone to Edward Warren, Tailor, 27 Sep
  - 1616 June-Hellen Warren, wife to Edward Warren of Hounsditch was buried in the churchyard neere Bedlwe ye xxvjth day.
  - 1616 Aug-Edward Warren, late citizen and saddler of London who dwelt in Hounsditch was buried in the burial place neere Moore-fields, the three and twenitieth day.

From the above burial records I find that both Helen and Edward Warren died three months apart. If Edward Warren changed his occupation from tailor to Saddlemaker then his son Symon Warren was buried in 1602 on 27 Sep.

#### Edward Warren

Edward Warren was born on Edward married to the as the son of Warren. widow of Wolstone Child, Elen or Helen Empson Child about 1602 probably in St. Ethelburga. The marriage date probably wasn't recorded as the parish records start in 1667 in St. Ethelburga, London. A Symon Warren son to Edward Warren, tailor was buried 27 Sep 1602. If Simon Warren was born of the first marriage of Edward, then his first wife probably died about the same time of 27 Sep 1602. However, there is no burial date to indicate that this is the case. It is possible that Simon Warren was the If however, Simon Warren son of another Edward Warren. was born of the marriage of Helen Empson Child and Edward Warren then the marriage took place between 18 March 1601 and 27 Sep 1602. There was one daughter which the couple had which survived named Abigail Warren.

Abigail Warren is named in John Bradshawe's will of 1606 as the daughter of my sister (in-law) Warren. Abigail Warren is named in the P.C.C Administration of Edward Warren in 1616. Benjamin Child the half brother of Abigail Warren was given her guardianship during Abigail's minority, and executor of Edward's estate. According to Edward Warren's burial record, he was a sadler by profession. Either Edward became very prosperous with an estate over 5000 pounds or he had property in two different counties, which automatically placed the settlement of his estate in the P.C.C. jurisdiction.
